That Car Of Yours

Heart-to-Heart Talks With Automobile Owners and Drivers on How to Get the Most Out of Their Cars at the Least Expense.

FLUSH GEAR HOUSINGS

It is strange that many motorists who would not think of falling to flush the crankcase occasionally, will let the transmission and differential gears go for their entire life without this salutary treatment. It is not enough to keep adding lubricant when the supply in these units gets low. Wear fills the grease with fillings and eventually it becomes more of a grinding compound than a lubricant. Flushing out the housing occasionally is the only certain remedy.

DISCONNECT THE BATTERY

Electrical repairs which involve the removal of some part of the current carrying equipment of the automobile never should be attempted without first disconnecting the battery. The simplest and most direct way to do this is by removing the ground wire. This is the only positive assurance against injury to one of the most delicate parts of the motor car.

BRAKES MUST BE PERFECT

Autumn, with its rains and its slippery streets, is here. The Summer just past has seen the car given relatively hard usage. The combination, in many instances, will call for serious consideration of the brake linings. For safe driving over slippery streets, the brakes must be equalized and the linings in the best of condition. Often the installation of new linings will be advisable for, with Winter coming on, brakes are due to get their most severe test.

WATCHFULNESS IS NEEDED

Subjected to heavy strains and constant motion, the U bolts of the springs are difficult to keep tightly adjusted. Smooth roads have done a great deal to eliminate the trouble caused by loosening of the nuts on these bolts, but no way of locking them absolutely has been devised. As a result, they should be watched. Any play is likely to mean leaf breakage. A sign of warning is the development of a rumbling noise when the car goes over a rough spot in the road.

GASOLINE GOOD BALLAST

Keeping the gasoline tank filled serves another purpose in addition to assuring one against running out of gas. It is surprising the difference in comfort it makes in the case of some roadsters, particularly the light ones. Weighing about six pounds to the gallon, gasoline makes good ballast. So, there is another reason to believe that it pays to keep "the last five gallons" constantly in the tank.

POSITION ALSO FACTOR

Many car owners assume that slow driving means driving under certain circumstances. This only is partly true, analysis of traffic mishaps shows. Position on the street also is an important factor. It is essential to remember that when proceeding at a temperate pace it is everyone's duty to drive slowly, and attempts to pass the slow-moving car in the middle of the street or highway have been productive of numerous accidents.

KEEP THEMSELVES CLEAN

Functioning at a high temperature, the points of modern spark plugs tend to keep themselves clean. The car owner, as a result, now may concentrate greater attention upon the plug insulator. Certain engine operating conditions will serve to give the insulator a carbon coating that will cause misfiring. This coating should be removed.

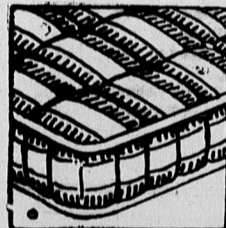

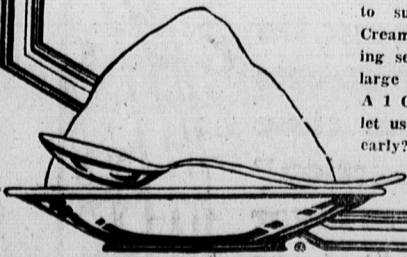

—EGG LAYING CONTEST—

Notes on the P. E. Island Egg Laying Contest For the Week Ending April 16, 1928.

The Experimental Station B. R. led the contest for the week with 64.1 points; the Experimental Station W. L. pen No. 4, were second with 67.5 points; Mr. Ludlow Jenkins' B. R. were third with 66.6 points; Mr. Harold Laird's B. R. were fourth with 64.1 points; and Mr. Everett Howatt's W. L. were fifth with 63.2 points.

Mr. Talmage Foster's B. R. hen No. 10, continues to lead the contest, for individual production, to date with 136.3 points; the K. B. C. Hatchery B. R. hen No. 3 is second with 129.5 points; the Model Poultry Yards B. R. hen No. 2 is third with 125.5 points; Mrs. J. F. Easton's W. L. hen No. 1 is fourth with 124.2 points; and Mr. S. R. Pendleton's B. R. hen No. 2 is fifth with 122.6 points.

The pens leading in total production to date are as follows:

First, Model Poultry Yards, B. R.—900.3 points.

Second, Mr. Talmage Foster's, B. R.—804.4 points.

Third, Exp. Station, W. L. pen 3—832.0 points.

Fourth, Exp. Station, W. L. pen 4—816.7 points.

Fifth, Mr. Everett Howatt's W. L.—796.7 points.

The total production for the week was 1055 eggs, and to date 12996. Twenty-eight hens laid every day during the week.
