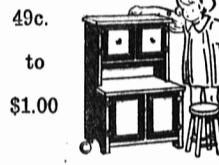

GLACE BAY, N.S. Dec. 21—(CP)—Negotiations for a new wage contract to replace the one expiring Jan. 31 were continued today by officials of the Dominion Steel and Coal Corporation and the executive of the United Mine Workers.

The proposals laid down by the U.M.W. Convention at Truro, requesting restoration of 1931 rates and an increase for dental workers, were placed before the Corporation officials and the meeting was adjourned until next week.

The little community of Vernon, P. E. I., was deeply shocked on Sunday morning, December 23rd, when the sudden and unexpected news of the passing of Mrs. Harold Jay became known. During the eight days previous to her death, the deceased, under expert medical attention and skilled nursing, fought a complicated of maladies so courageously and cheerfully, that friends and attendants believed the Grim Reaper would be denied his victim; however the ways of Providence are not our ways, and God called her back to Himself, at the early age of thirty four years. McGuigan, whose consolations during her sickness helped Mrs. Jay to fight her losing battle for life so courageously.
