The coming season bids fair to be the best so far as shipments of smelts from this port is concerned, says the North Sydney Herald of Nov. 19th. As a year several local fishermen have the industry in a ready result that today they are ready for the big season's work. During the past few days it is estimated that three thousand boxes of smelts were shipped along the New Brunswick and P. E. Island railway to the American market. While the industry has not been worked in Cape Breton to the extent in the two afore mentioned areas, it is nevertheless an unimportant part of the kind of fish taken in Cape Breton waters is better, and therefore commands a better price. For the past several days a representative of a New York concern has been in town negotiating for the entire catch of local fishermen, and when it is remembered the prices paid are higher than that of any other fish, a banner season is anticipated.

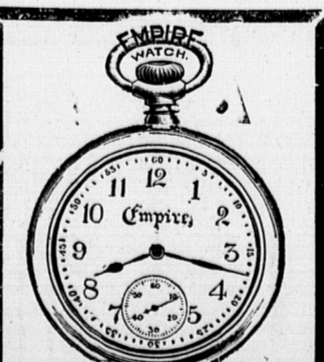
