The latest news, first of all.

Souris reports lobster fishing on the south side. On the north side the fishermen are just getting underway. Bait is not plentiful. At Georgetown the weather has interfered with hauling the traps. With the exception of good catches of herring for a couple of days at Launching, the supply of bait is scarcely equal to the demand.

Rev. John McDonald will conduct services in the Presbyterian Church, Montague, tomorrow morning and evening, at the usual hours.

Dealers in Montague, yesterday were paying thirty cents per bush for potatoes, eighteen cents per lb for butter, sixteen cents per dozen for eggs, eight to eight and a half cents per lb for pork and six to eight dollars per ton for loose hay.

Thos. Kitcham, Souris, has finished loading the schooner Alice Phoebe at Souris, with produce for Halifax.

Big catches of herring have been made at Georgetown this week. The heavy wind has interfered with the catches of lobsters.

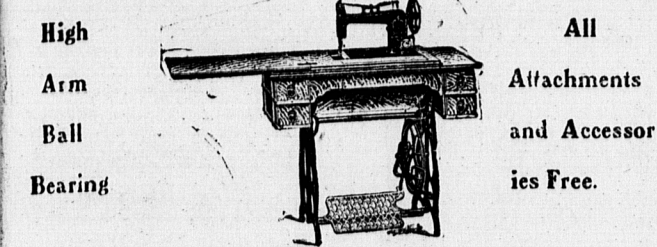
Mrs. Elizabeth MacDonald who has been visiting at Murray Harbor and Charlottetown returned to her home in Georgetown yesterday.

WASHINGTON, May 13—Setting out on a three weeks' horseback ride from here to western New York, Mrs. Herbert Wadsworth, accompanied by Miss Margaret Carey, of Buffalo; George Marvin and Edward P. Smith left here yesterday.

Miss Ethel Roosevelt was to have been one of the party, but was compelled, on her physician's advice, to decline the invitation. Eleven horses, three grooms and two wagon loads of baggage are in the entourage.

The party went by way of Virginia, their stopping place tonight being Fairfax, Genesee, Mrs. Wadsworth's summer home in western New York is their destination.

NEW ENGLAND BALLOON TO START FOR CANADA

BOSTON, May 12—Wind and weather being favorable, the new 56,000 cubic foot balloon Massachusetts of the Aero Club of New England, which is to be christened, at Pittsfield Saturday morning, will make an attempt to reach the Canadian frontier on its initial voyage.

The balloon will be piloted by Chas. J. Glidden, of Boston, and the passengers will be Frank B. Collins, of Boston, vice-president of the Aero Club of New England, and General Otis Draper, of Hopkedge, nephew of Governor Draper.

EMPEROR WILLIAM PRAISES KING VICTOR

BRINDISI, May 13—The Hohenzollern on entering the harbor, collided with the Italian torpedo boat destroyer, Nembo, seriously damaging the latter.

At the lunch on board the Vittorio Emanuele, the Emperor made reference to the earthquake disaster, and expressed the greatest admiration for the courage and self-sacrifice shown by the Italian Sovereigns in personally visiting the devastated districts and a ding the sufferers.

WINNIPEG'S MODEST REQUEST OF GOV'T

OTTAWA, May 12—A large delegation of Winnipeg business men, representing the board of trade and the city council, arrived in Ottawa tonight to urge the government to make a substantial grant towards the proposed Winnipeg world's fair in 1912.

They met the western members of parliament tonight and secured their unanimous support for the proposal. The exhibition will, it is estimated, cost \$4,000,000, whereof Winnipeg will give \$500,000, the rate receipts are relied upon for \$1,000,000 and the dominion government is asked to subscribe the balance of \$2,500,000.

MONTREAL TUNNEL BILL

OTTAWA, May 13—The Railway Committee at its last sitting passed the bill respecting the Montreal Bridge and Terminal Company. It overrode the recommendation of the Standing Orders committee that the powers asked in section 3 and 4 of the bill should not be granted because of insufficient advertising. The clauses in question provided (1) that after the tunnel work had been commenced, and 15 per cent. of the estimate was expended the company may construct another bridge or tunnel across or under the river, near Lachine.

(2) That it may build elevators, warehouse terminals, hotels and amusement places.

The bill now goes to the House as it came from the Senate.

STEAMER TUNISIAN IS IN JEOPARDY.

MONTREAL, May 11—The Allan Line, this afternoon received a message from the Tunisian, in the ice, sixty miles off Cape Race, saying that the ship had one plate in her bows broken and was making water. A great deal of ice is reported in the Gulf. The Empress of Britain is also being held up. If the Tunisian is too

severely damaged her passengers will be brought by rail via Port Au Hasque.

LATER.

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld., May 14—Leaking in the forehold in consequence of running into high fields of ice off Cape Race the big Allan Line steamer Tunisian from Liverpool for Montreal put into this port. It is not known whether the Tunisian is badly damaged.
