THE TIME OF THE JUDGES.

Judg. 2. 7-16. Memorise verses 18, 19.

LESSON HELPS.

7. "All the days of Joshua"—The generation who had made the covenant at Shechem were faithful to it.

9. "Timnah-heres"—The same as Timnah-herah; this was Joshua's own inheritance.—See Josh. 19. 50.

10. "Generation gathered"—All the elders and leaders were gone; subsequent events proved how much they had lost in them. "Knew not the Lord"—This phrase is so comprehensive that it explains at once all their moral corruptness. "Works which he had done for Israel"—Showing their lack of interest in that remarkable history of their fathers.

11. "Served Baalim"—This word means lords, for they conceived their gods as rulers and governors; but when they wanted to specify any particular Baal, they added a name distinguishing it from the rest, as Baal-Peor, and Baal-ze-bub.

12. "Bowed themselves"—In their worship of these idols there is the act of submission; it was in this act of submission that they actually forsook the God who brought them out of Egypt.

13. "Ashtaroth"—A goddess of the Canaanites, and worshipped with obscene rites.

14. "Anger of the Lord"—This awful phrase occurs often in the recital of the history of the Israelites; God was angry because he loved his people, and his love is shown quite as clearly in his judgments upon wrong-doing as in the blessings with which he crowns obedience.

"Sold them"—All their miseries are described as the direct judgments of God; instead of possessing the land, they are now the slaves of the Canaanites, bought and sold as merchandise.

15. "Whithersoever"—there was no escape from the wrath of God; they were not only without God, for they forsook him, but they had the Lord "against them."

16. "Judges"—These were leaders who were governors and captains, sometimes filling the office of prophet also, and who were raised up for the special purpose of delivering Israel from her misfortunes and to lead her from her backslidings.

QUESTIONS FOR HOMESTUDY.

Joshua's Death and Israel's Idolatry.—How long were the people faithful to the covenant which was made at Shechem? What had the people of that generation seen of the works of the Lord? How old was Joshua when he died? Where was he buried? Of what was the succeeding generation ignorant? What gods did they serve? In worshipping idols, what did they forsake? How did the Lord look upon their sin?

The Judgements of the Lord.—What was the consequence of their idolatry? Into what kind of captivity were they taken? Could they prosper as long as God was against them? How did the Lord relieve their distress? What were the duties of a judge? Did they obey their judges? How was the judge qualified for his work? What is meant by "I repented the Lord"? What was the reason for such repenting? Did the people profit by these severe but valuable lessons? What way did they go? Why is it called stubborn way?
