DARLINGTON, Wis., June 17 (U. P.)—The 100th anniversary of the battle of Pecatonica, one of the most decisive engagements of the Blackhawk war, will be celebrated on the battlefield near here June 16, 1932. After six white settlers had been killed by Indians, Col. Henry Dodge, later territorial governor, led an "army" of 21 whites, mostly miners against a band of 17 Indians. Four of the whites were killed and the remaining 17 on each side fought a furious hand to hand battle.

FARMERS TO JOIN FIGHT ON GAS TAX EXEMPTION

SANTA FE, N. M., June 17 (U.P.) Campaigns to raise funds to engage attorneys in the defense of the gasoline tax exemption law are being conducted among farmers of New Mexico.

The state highway department will attack the constitutionality of the law, which exempts from taxation gasoline used for purposes other than in automobiles on highways. The farmers contend that if the law is declared constitutional

they will save many thousands of dollars annually, especially farmers who use tractors.
