A sister of the deceased, Elizabeth, also lives at the homestead. The funeral took place on the 2nd inst and the services were conducted by Rev. D. McLean. The pall-bearers were Nell Matheson, John Henderson, Lemuel McLean, Archibald McKinnon, John Wattle and James Wattle.

The proposed civic legislation with regard to the dogs of Charlottetown has, it is said, been abandoned. Victoria, the capital of British Columbia, has a peculiar municipal franchise. Every person who pays a \$2 dog tax is entitled to vote in elections for mayor and aldermen. The system has led to abuse. It has been discovered in the strength of a single dog. Municipal franchise reform is now regarded as a question of urgency in Victoria and the unkind association of dogs with mayors and aldermen is doomed.
