TO STUDY LIFE IN GREAT LAKES

OTTAWA, Feb. 1.—One of the most distinguished sons of Canada will do the Dominion a service this summer, Sir John Murray has agreed to make a study of life in the Great Lakes and the bottom characteristics generally of those great bodies of water. He proposes to bring out his deep sea exploring vessel and to co-operate with the Dominion Biological Board.

Sir John Murray was born in Cobourg, Ontario, and obtained his earlier education in London, Cobourg. To-day he is recognized as the world's greatest oceanographer and has been decorated by almost every country in Europe. He was one of the naturalists on the famous Challenger expedition, where a warship was sent out by the British Government and spent many years exploring the depths of the ocean. Sir John Murray prepared the report of that expedition, which was published and made fifty large volumes. He has published many other books on submerged life, and only last year conducted an expedition at his own expense. His researches have not been confined to the ocean, for he has published works on the Scottish Lochs.

The Dominion Biologic Board met this week at Ottawa under the presidency of Professor Prince, and made preliminary arrangements. It was decided to arrange with the International Council of Sea Exploration for research work in Canadian waters.

WILL NOT KNOW FATHER'S FATE.

NEW YORK, Feb. 3.—A baby daughter, born Saturday to Mrs. Charles Becker, wife of the former police lieutenant, who is in the death house at Sing Sing awaiting execution for the murder of Herman Rosenthal, the gambler, died on Sunday. The attending physicians from the first had held out little hope of preserving the life of the child, owing to its condition of general weakness.
