stone of the pure home and of the pure place of evening entertainment. "But," again says some one to me, "why do you use the future tense? Why do you say, 'The Sabbath day is to be the golden gate which shall open to let the laboring man into the higher and the nobler life of the Spirit?'"

The labor unions may logically base their claims upon physical grounds. "Rest, rest! Give us more rest!" cry the barber unions and the grocery clerk unions and the drug store clerk unions and all other unions.

A consecrated and ropelized ballot box is also to be a great factor in teaching the laboring classes how to spend their evenings. This means that by the election of the proper health officials and county attorneys and municipal representatives the better classes shall be able to go into the city slums and clean out the vile formations and accumulations of filth.

But, ye laboring men, how are we to win in these three great movements which we have been developing? How are we to get the Holy Spirit inspired institutional church, and the Christian Sabbath as a day for rest and worship, and a gospel ballot box to care for our depraved? Shall we ultimately or ever triumph in these three great movements for the purification of the laborer's evenings? Not in our own strength, but in the strength of Jesus Christ we shall, and we can do everything, if we will only trust him and work for him.

One day, so goes the story, an old Scotch preacher arose and first gave out as his text the following words from Philippians (iv. 13): "I can do all things." Then he stopped. A look of surprise went around the congregation, for this minister was a humble man. But after a pause the preacher said: "Ah, I did not read the text right. If any man says to me 'I can do all things' I know he is a liar. But if he reads my whole text and says 'I can do all things' through Christ, which strengtheneth me," then I say he tells the truth.

THE SUNDAY SCHOOL. LESSON XI, THIRD QUARTER, INTERNATIONAL SERIES, SEPT. 13.

Text of the Lesson: II Sam. ii, 1-10. Memory Verses: 1-3—Golden Text: Ps. cxxxiii, 1—Commentary Prepared by Rev. D. M. Stearns.

The title of our lesson is "David becomes King," and it would seem as if the fifth chapter should have been chosen instead of this one, as there David is anointed king of all Israel, while in this lesson he is only anointed king of Judah; but as chapter v is suggested as a study in connection with this the ground is thus covered. Some have wondered how David with such a record as he has in Scripture could ever be called "a man after God's own heart" (I Sam. xiii, 14; Acts xiii, 22), but there are at least two rays of light on this. One is that the evil in David's life was the exception, not the rule, and the other is that it was in the matter of the kingdom and his reliance upon and obedience to God that he was a man after God's heart.

Not only his own household, but all his faithful followers and their households, share with him his rest and his kingdom; so shall it be when the Son of David (Matt. i, 1) shall have come to His kingdom. All His faithful followers shall reign with Him (Rev. iii, 21; v, 9, 10; xx, 6). David's 600 were not always faithful to him (I Sam. xxx, 6), and who is there among the disciples of Christ who can truly say, "Surely the Captain may depend on me?" No one who knows anything of himself will ever talk of his faithfulness, but will rather rejoice in I Cor. i, 9; x, 13; I Thess. v, 24.

In chapter v, 3, we read that all the elders of Israel anointed him king over Israel. In I Sam. xvi, 13, Samuel anointed him king in the midst of his brethren, so that he was three times anointed. For the full light upon this we must wait till He of whom David was a type shall have come to His kingdom. While David was king at Hebron over Judah one of Saul's sons was king of Israel and resisted him, but the house of Saul waxed weaker and weaker, and David waxed stronger and stronger. So David went on and grew great (going and growing), and the Lord God of Hosts was with him (verses 8-10; chapter v, 3, 10). Though our Lord is still rejected and by the world disowned, He will surely come to His kingdom and His throne, for God has said, "I will overturn, overturn it, and it shall be no more until He come whose right it is, and I will give it Him" (Ezek. xxi, 27). He is now waiting on His Father's throne (Rev. iii, 21; Ps. cx, 1), but He will as truly come to His own throne as David did (Jer. iii, 17).

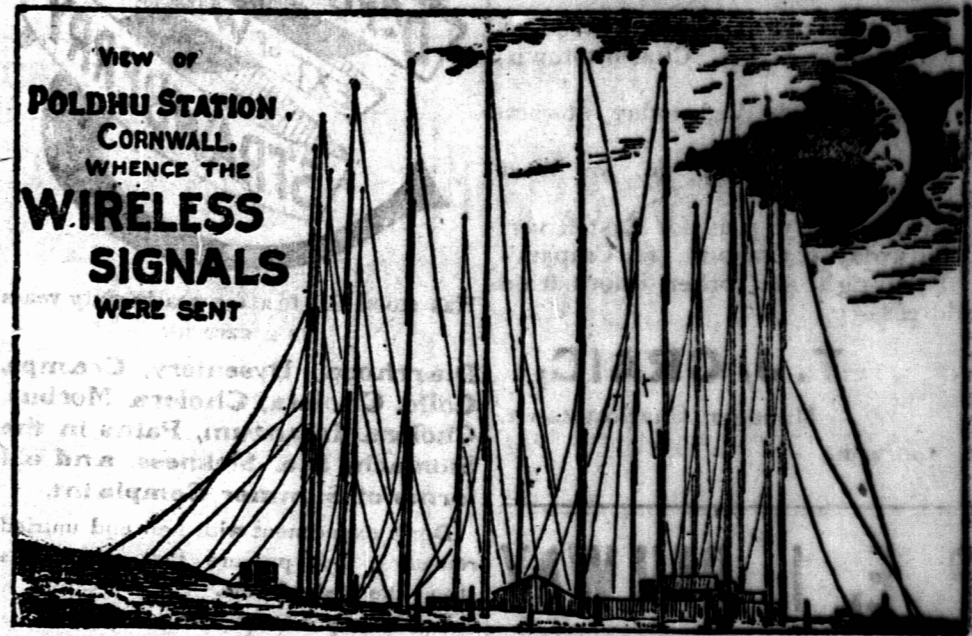
These are some of the words of David concerning the men of Jabesh Gilead who kindly buried the bodies of Saul and his sons (I Sam. xxxi, 11-13). Our Lord has Himself assured us that not even a cup of water given in His name shall lose its reward and that in the time of recompense, the resurrection of the just, He will reward every one according to his work (Mark ix, 41; Luke xiv, 14; Rev. xxii, 12). Since these men are so kindly spoken of because of their kindness to these dead bodies, rescuing them from further dishonor, what shall be said of Joseph and Nicodemus, who rescued the body of our Lord from a grave with the wicked and gave it a place of honorable burial? (Isa. liii, 9).

Kings die, circumstances change, friends, health and wealth may all fail, but One has said that He will never fail us nor forsake us, so that we can always say, "Thou, O Lord, remainest forever" (Heb. xiii, 5; 1; Lam. v, 19). Only as we see Him, the King who never dies, can we be strong and of good courage. Let us lay to heart the following among many of the encouraging words of Scripture for all believers: Josh. i, 7, 9; II Chron. xx, 7; Hag. ii, 4; I Cor. xv, 58. Since it is written that "He shall not fail nor be discouraged" (Isa. xli, 4), there is no good reason why any of His redeemed should ever be cast down (Ps. xli, 5; I; xliii, 5).

Saul, Ish-bosheth and all other enemies of God and His people from Cain onward are forerunners of the man of sin, the antichrist, the last great enemy of God and man, who shall with his companion be cast alive into the lake of fire when the Lord Jesus shall come in power and glory to overthrow all His enemies and take the kingdom (Rev. xix, 11-21). All such enemies are controlled and possessed by the devil, the first one who ever questioned the word of God and turned man away from Him, but the devil and all his works, even death itself, shall be swept off the face of the earth, and Jesus shall reign (I Cor. xv, 26, 28) in the new earth wherein dwelleth righteousness.
