

IN MEMORIAM

JOSEPH F. DOYLE
 It is an outstanding fact that each one prepares the true material for his own obituary. It is for this reason that in offering tribute to the memory of the late Joseph F. Doyle one feels a hesitancy lest due to the inefficacy of words one would detract in the slightest degree from the worthy reputation he made for himself among his associates. Judged by his fellowmen in his duty to his God and to his neighbours he was never found wanting, being at all times practical, devoted, and sincere, which in itself is a sufficient epitaph.

He was born in French Village, seventy-one years ago and there he made his home during his whole lifetime.

In his younger years he sought for an education. An ardent student he was then and a student he remained until his death. To those who knew him there was immediately apparent a thoroughness in the knowledge he had acquired. He was a thinker, not after the manner of a sophist, eratic and superficial, but of one who builds his knowledge upon sound fundamental principles.

He taught school for a number of years and at the same time managed a farm, both of which he accomplished successfully. Later he was appointed Inspector of Schools and into this work he carried those sane, constructive principles characteristic of his earlier work among young students, causing him to be regarded truly as a leading figure in the cause of education in the rural districts of the Island.

For several years past he did not enjoy good health, but only for a few months previous to his death was he an invalid.

Those left to mourn his passing are: his wife (nee Mary Mooney), four sons and six daughters, Desmond of Mt. Stewart, Emmet of Toronto, James and Alfred at home, Annie, R. N., Lauretta (Mrs. Jos. Feehan), Minnie (Mrs. Jas. Travers), and Agnes of Boston Mass., Margaret (Mrs. Rod MacAdam) St. Peter's and Dora, teacher at St. Peter's. One brother, Alfred of Baltimore, two sisters, Mrs. John O'Hanley, Pt. de Roche and Mrs. John Fiske, Blooming Point.

On Nov. 17th his remains were borne to St. Andrew's Church, whence after a High Mass of Requiem they were laid in the adjoining cemetery. The funeral procession was headed by his brother members of the St. Andrew's Branch C. M. B. A., who also acted as pall-bearers.

was designed and wrought by Massey Rhind, A. R. S. A., a native of Edinburgh who spends his summers at Chester, Nova Scotia. Mr. Rhind is the sculptor of a number of Nova Scotia works of art, including several war memorials.

In his study of the Dalhousie bust, the sculptor had access to all the original memorials at the family seat in Edinburgh where there hangs a full length portrait of Dalhousie as captain of the King's Bodyguard of Royal Archers, painted in 1830 by Sir John Watson Gordon, a distinguished artist of the time.

The donor, Mr. Macgillivray, for many years has presented the university with autographed photographs of notable men, and of the hundreds of carefully chosen books he has added to the library the majority are autographed by their authors. English Woman Plans Flights In Large Plane

NOW CRUISING MEDITERRANEAN WATERS IN "FLOATING AND FLYING HOME" WILL CROSS ATLANTIC.

 LONDON, Dec. 14—A gigantic yacht of the air is being primed for a flight across the Atlantic when the open season for this sort of thing arrives next Spring or early next Summer. The flying boat, completed by the Supermarine Vickers Company, will be in charge of another daring woman of the skies, Mrs. J. J. James, of London. Just now it is on a test cruise in Mediterranean waters.

Sleeping quarters, wardrobes and bookcases are built in the hull of the big three-engined ship which resembles a winged pullman. It is called the Windward III, and with a full load of fuel for its powerful Armstrong-Siddeley motors, weighs about 10½ tons.

While the exact destination of Mrs. James, should she go through with the flight, is not definitely known, it has been reported Montreal and New York city are two of the points to be visited if a successful crossing is made. Thomas Rose, formerly a flight lieutenant in the Royal Air Force, will pilot the ship. Its high-lift monoplane wing is 92 feet from tip to tip.

The Windward's power units are mounted in the leading edge of the wing, in the centre and on both sides of the hull.
