Sinai Graduate Nurse's College of New York and went to Plainfield from Trudeau Hospital at Saratoga. The Camp was built by seven hundred private citizens who banded themselves together in the Anti-Tuberculosis League and subscribed many hundreds of dollars for that purpose. It costs \$300 a month to carry of the camp but so far there has been no difficulty in meeting the expense. The nurses are doing excellent work. The Journal of that City says the patients are making steady progress to recovery.
