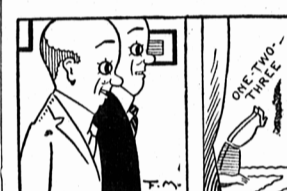

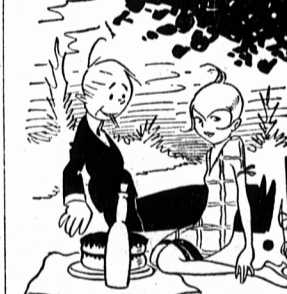

BERLIN LIMITS "BARGAIN DAYS"

(By British United Press) BERLIN, July 10.—Clearance sales are henceforth to be closely supervised by the Berlin police, and the prefect has just published a set of rules for their regulations.

This edict sets forth that seasonal clearance sales shall not be held more than twice a year and fixes the dates for them. The winter clearing sale may take place only between January 2 and February 15 and the summer sale between July 1 and August 15.

It is also ordered that the date of beginning and ending such a sale shall be marked up on a prominent place in front of the shop and in no case may the sale be extended beyond the date specified.

The shopkeeper or firm is bound to send in, at latest three days before the reduced prices come into force, a declaration of the special reason for holding the sale.

He must also specify the exact quantities, weight and price of the various goods he has in stock, the price of which he intends to reduce, and he is strictly forbidden under a heavy penalty to increase his stocks in any one line before holding such a clearance sale.

"It's some as the new regulations are in some respects," said the owner of a large soft-goods firm, "some such provision is absolutely necessary if we are to be protected from the unfair competition of the people who, if they could, would have their windows full of bogus selling-off notices the whole year round."

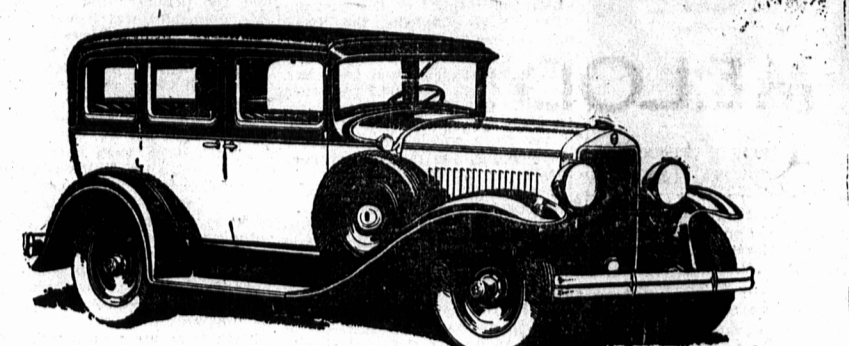
