## THE FLYING MACHINE.

Persistent efforts are being made to create a flying machine that will carry itself and one or more men to direct it through the air. It has been claimed that Wright Brothers, of Ohio have succeeded in doing this, but no public exhibition has been yet made of their machine or their flight. It is significant that Wright Brothers did not take part in the recent competition near Paris at which the world's flyers were invited to take part and at which generous rewards were offered. The prize of a handsome cup, was offered for the machine which would rise by its own power and continue its forward motion through the air a distance of 25 metres, (82 feet). Ten thousand dollars was offered as a prize for a machine which would rise from the ground and fly the length of a kilometre (3,280.8 feet) in a circle. Santos Dumont, the famous Brazilian aeronaut, won the cup. He drove his aeroplane 100 feet through the air at a height of 20 feet from the ground. The larger prize was not won by anybody.

It is to be observed that there is a vast difference between a balloon with a power attachment and steering gear, and a flying machine which has no balloon to support it. Santos Dumont had already achieved great eminence as a balloonist. In a calm atmosphere with his dirigible balloon he had demonstrated that he could soar aloft or descend, and move at considerable speed in any direction. With his flying machine unsupported by gas he was able to move but fifty yards through the air. His flying machine with his own weight added makes a total weight of 500 pounds. His motor is of 50 horse power. When he had flown 150 feet he shut off the power and the machine came to the ground with such suddenness that it was badly broken. The experiment is of great interest as the first public competition of pure flying machines witnessed by thousands of people. Wright Brothers claim to have made prolonged flights with a machine of twice the weight and only half the power of Santos Dumont's flyer, but this has not been done in public and there are many who doubt the story. We doubt not, however, that the flying machine will yet in some sort succeed, but flying through the air will be rather too expensive if not also too perilous for ordinary mortals.

When writing the paragraph which appeared in yesterday's Guardian referring to a recent prohibition case we were not aware that a writ of certiorari had been applied for which interrupted the usual course of proceedings. Had we been aware of this fact the paragraph would not have been written and we regret its publication.

## HYMAN AND FOSTER.

Mr. Hyman is Minister of Public Works in the Laurier Cabinet. Mr. Foster was long the Finance Minister of a Conservative regime. Just now there have been very painful revelations in court as to the manner in which Mr. Hyman was elected. These revelations make it apparent that the seat was stolen by bribery, ballot switching and the perjury of deputy returning officers. The Opposition press and the independent press with one voice demand his resignation. They argue that if he did not know what was being done unlawfully to secure his election he ought to have known, and that in any case he has no right to retain stolen goods knowing them to be stolen. The Minister of Justice and the ministerial press, with more or less hesitancy defend Mr. Hyman. He does not openly defend himself, having in the storm of public disapproval betaken himself to the "cyclone cellar."

One defence set up is that the people who are demanding Mr. Hyman's resignation from the Cabinet and the Commons do not also demand the resignation of Mr. Foster. Mr. Foster is blamed and has come under much newspaper censure for his conduct in connection with land speculation in the North West. We cannot defend him. We do not regard his defence of himself as sound, or worthy of a prominent public man. But there is a wide difference between his case and that of Mr. Hyman. His worst enemies do not contend that Mr. Foster was not honestly elected. This is the vital difference. We have still the hope that Mr. Hyman, who is a capable administrator and but for the election scandal has always been reputed an honorable man, will resign the seat he holds. Under the stress of widespread and general disapproval his retention of the seat must prove a source of weakness to the Administration and to the Liberal party, and tend also to lower the standard of public life in Canada. Mr. Foster has lost much of the public confidence he once held but there is nothing in his action which can properly form a shield for the untenable position now held by the Minister of Public Works.

It is recalled by the storm as a remarkable fact that this Province, though in a much exposed position and with a coast line of four or five hundred miles, has not a single life-saving station. The curvature of the north shore of the Island makes it extremely difficult for vessels or steamers to save themselves in an eastern north-eastern or northern gale. One or more life-stations ought to be provided without delay. The alarming position of the crew of the Turret Bell during the present storm accentuates the call for such protection as a life station and life-saving appliances would give.

The Patriot in an eloquent account of the storm, tells that "trees are blown down which never blew down before." But that was only a slip of the pen.

The storm of the past six days has been one of very great severity and continuance. It is remarkable in several respects for a storm in this part of the world. For nearly a week it has lashed our shores with furious waves. In that time the wind has traveled thousands of miles at the 30 to 40 mile rate which has prevailed, rising to much greater velocity in frequent gusts. Fortunately the temperature has been too mild for snow. Had the three and a half inches of rain which fell during the storm come down in the form of snow, which in November is quite a possible contingency, we should have had nearly three feet of snow drifted into such heaps as would have blocked all traffic on the railways and highways.

Today is election day in the United States. Many state Governors and other officials will be elected, but at this distance the greatest interest centres in the contests in New York and Massachusetts, notably the first-named state, where Hughes and Hearst are the opposing candidates for the Governorship. The interest in this election is very great throughout the Republic and President Roosevelt has made a strong personal effort in behalf of Hughes, the Republican candidate. Both parties express great confidence in the result, no withstanding that the betting is over two to one in favor of Hughes. It is easy to say that Hughes' election is probable, but there is a feeling that the election of Hearst is by no means impossible. We hope to announce the result tomorrow morning. Should the contest be close the result may be in doubt for a day or two.
