NATIONAL SELECTIVE SERVICE
Fourth Compulsory Employment
Transfer Order
A Direction to Specified Employers and Employees
 This Order applies to any young man who is 16, 17 or 18
 years of age, and who is working at any one of the employ-
 ments specified in this notice. It is also directed to the
 present employers of these young men.

A. Objective
 The Order provides for the transfer of the young men
 affected, to work which is of more importance to Canada's war
 effort. Transfers will be made after taking into account the
 health and domestic circumstances of these young men.

B. YOUNG MEN WHO ARE AFFECTED:
 Every young man who is in any one of the employ-
 ments specified, who has reached his 16th birthday but
 has not reached his 19th birthday, is covered by this
 Order.

C. EMPLOYMENTS SPECIFIED IN THE ORDER:
 The Order applies to the young men described above
 if now employed in any of these occupations:
 (1) Any occupation in or associated with the follow-
 ing: (a) barber shops and beauty parlours; (b) dis-
 tillation alcohol for beverage; (c) dyeing, cleaning and
 pressing, baths, guide service, shoe shining; (d) entertain-
 ment, motion picture companies, clubs, bowling alleys, pool
 rooms; (e) operation of ice cream parlours and soda
 fountains; (f) manufacture of feathers, plumes and arti-
 ficial flowers, chewing gum, wine, lace goods, greeting
 cards, jewelry; (g) retail stores; (h) factory production of
 statuary and art goods; (i) retail and wholesale florists;
 (j) retail sale of confectionery, candy, tobacco, books,
 stationery, news; (k) retail sale of motor vehicles or ac-
 cessories; (l) retail sale of sporting goods or musical instru-
 ments; (m) service stations (gasoline-filling stations); (n)
 taverns, liquor, wine and beer stores.
 (2) Bus boy; charman and cleaner; custom furrier;
 dancing teacher; dish washer; domestic servant; doorman
 and starter; elevator operator; greens keeper; grounds

Employers or employees uncertain of the application of this Order in a particular case are advised to communicate immediately with the nearest Employment and Selective Service Office.

Attention is directed to the fact that the Third Compulsory Order, which contains a list of occupations different from the above, also requires certain young men 16, 17 and 18 years of age to report to National Selective Service.

Army Film Unit Shoots Rehearsal For Invasion



Canadian Army Film Unit camera men follow the invasion exercises of Canadian troops on the shores of England. Edited at the National Film Board, Ottawa, the results of their work can now be seen in the "World in Action" release, "Letter From Overseas".

As the hands of the invasion clock swing towards zero hour the Canadian Army in Britain were ready to strike like a thunderbolt against the defense of Europe. Across the sea the English countryside the great armoured battalions crash through battle exercises under screens of R. C.A.F. fighters and bombers. From behind their camouflage heavy guns roar as the invasion force is trained to the split second, sweeps over the beach to seize their objectives.
 Following with their cameras the life and training of Canadian troops in England the Canadian Army Film Unit has captured the spirit and drive of men from the Maritimes, Quebec, Ontario, the Western Prairies and the Pacific Coast, and back to Canada their film has come to be made into the National Film Board production, "Letter From Overseas".
 The picture, released in the "World in Action" series, opens in Canada with a woman receiving a letter from her son in England. their barges and engineers begin the
 With modest understatement he writes that "things are quiet over here." Flashing back to England the picture picks up Canadian troops in spectacular hardening up exercises, playing football against English and Norwegian teams, parading for inspection by Lieut. General McNaughton.
 On August 19th, 1942, Canadian troops sail out into the English Channel. Their destinations—Varengeville, Bruneval and Dieppe. As dawn breaks out across the sky cameras pick out the great flotilla of warships, landcraft and auxiliary vessels. Across the sky come the great squadrons of the Royal Canadian Air Force. A stray German bomber flies over the convoy and is shot down into the sea.
 Just before 5 a.m. the order comes to man the landing craft. Over the side go the Canadian troops and open big guns of escorting warships open up against the coast defenses.
 On the beach men swarm ashore under heavy fire. Tanks tumble off their barges and engineers begin the demolition of beach defenses.
 After nine hours ashore Canadians return to England, leaving a gaping hole in Hitler's front ring of European fortifications.
 Then the training begins again. New lessons of attack are taught and new weapons arrive from Canadian arsenals.
 The Canadian Women's Army Corps joining their brothers-in-arms overseas, work with a will in Army headquarters and stations. Many of them volunteer for civilian anti-air fighting and prove that they are as handy with a stirrup pump as they are with a typewriter. Even the harvest doesn't escape their attention, and they are soon wielding pitchforks in England's grain fields.
 In London's Hyde Park massed Canadian pipe bands put on a full dress display. Participating are regiments from Nova Scotia, Ontario and Alberta.
 "Letter From Overseas" closes on Canadian troops practicing large scale amphibious operations—a hint, perhaps, that the days of rehearsal are drawing to a close.
