BROWNIES

1 egg 1 cup sugar
2 squares melted chocolate
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
1/3 cup milk 1 cup pastry flour
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons melted shortening
1/2 cup nuts or raisins
Beat the eggs, add the sugar and melted chocolate and vanilla. Then add the sifted dry ingredients and the milk. Lastly add the nuts and melted shortening. Bake in a greased shallow cake pan (about 8 x 10 inches) in a 275 degree F. oven for 20 minutes.

My wife is 35 years old and we have four children—yet I have to listen to these tales about how she is pursued by the wives even though she professes to love me. What do you think about it? A DISGUSTED HUSBAND.

ANSWER: It is easy enough to understand your wife's little game. She is one of the hen-brained women who thinks that the way to hold her husband is to keep him green-eyed with jealousy. She believes that she keeps you on tenterhooks for fear you may lose her, and she hasn't gumption enough to know that she is making you wish you could.

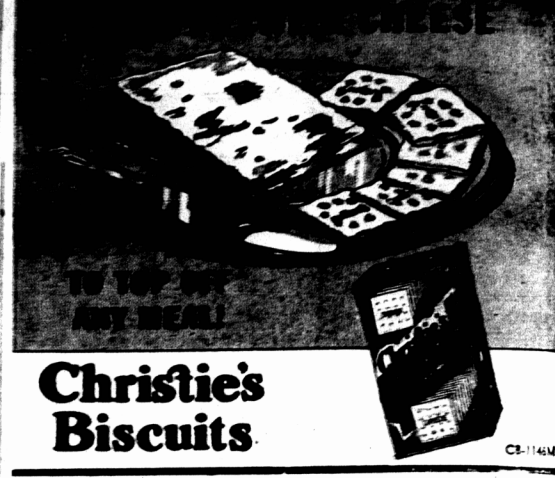
I still love my husband and want to do what is right for all concerned. What do you think it is?
