Bandits Of Paris

PARIS, July 9.

Organized in international outlaws is engaged in the battle of its life against the constituted authorities of civilization represented by the French police. Fourteen men and women, the keenest minds in their field, are temporarily reposing in the auto-chamber of the penitentiary, while all the astuteness and police resources of the Paris police department are being employed to make their stay permanent.

It isn't an easy task, this of trying to prove to the satisfaction of a jury that a certain man, although his police record in several countries, was actually guilty of taking two, three, or ten thousand dollars away from a confiding gentleman from Indiana, or a couple of thousand pounds sterling from a visitor from the Australian bush on the assumption that the said money was to be placed on an ornamental horse who wouldn't possibly lose, or to be distributed among the poverty-stricken refugees of an earthquake-rocked region in South America or Central Asia.

Is William Warren, sleek and suave, well-bred and prosperous, owner of automobiles, race horses and villas, spending his winters on the Riviera and his summers at Deauville, identical with William Warren, known to the Australia and English police as "Bludge Bill," sentenced in 1901 at Sydney, New South Wales, to eighteen months imprisonment with violence for robbing with violence a half-dozen occasions of the prison guardians of England, Belgium, Germany and Austria?

For William Warren is supposed to be the head, the brains, the directing genius of the greatest band of international crooks that has ever been hatched in by one of the French dragnet. Under the auspicious of the car the police found French, Spanish and English banknotes amounting to about two thousand dollars while in front of Milady Warren reposed a pair of prize puppies valued at two or three thousand more.

They inspired "confidence."

Their methods are simple. They dealt with simple folk. Therefore the traces of their crimes are hard to find. When the victim wakes up to find that his roll has disappeared, or that the man who was going to see the Pope about the charity hospital couldn't tell a church from a synagogue, he usually goes home air says nothing about it to the neighbours. Therefore Warren and his gang were comparatively safe.

Enough evidence has been adduced to enable the Paris police to detain "Bludge Bill" and his company while the examining magistrate probes their histories. How to Make Red or Black Currant Jelly

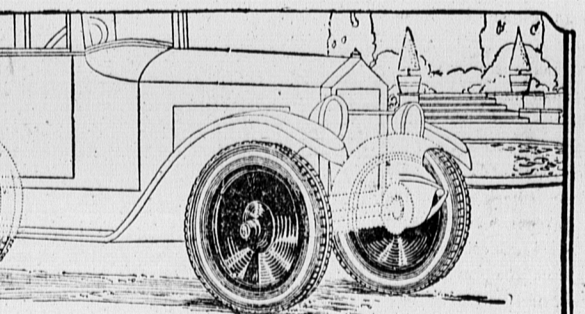
Crush well about 3 1/2 lbs. ripe fruit. Add 1 cup water, stir until boiling, cover pan and simmer 10 minutes. Place in jelly bag and squeeze out juice. Measure 4 1/2 cups juice into large saucepan. Measure 7 1/2 level cups (3 1/2 lbs.) sugar in separate pan. Bring juice just to

boil, and begin to add sugar slowly, with constant stirring, taking about 5 minutes to add sugar, keeping juice nearly at boil. Then bring to boil, and at once add 1/2 bottle (containing 1/2 cup) Certo, stirring constantly, and bring again to a full boil, for 1/2 minute. Remove from fire, let stand 1 minute, skim and pour quickly.
