S. S. LESSON.

MAY 19.
JESUS ASCENDS INTO HEAVEN.
Luke 24. 44-53; Acts 1. 1-11. Memory Verses, 9 11.

GOLDEN TEXT.
While he blessed them, he was parted from them, and carried up into heaven.—Luke 24. 51.

OUTLINE.
1. The Promise of the Father, v. 1-8.
2. The Farewell of the Son, v. 9-11.
Time.—According to the usual reckoning Jesus rose from the dead on April 9, A. D. 30 (which day we would call Sunday), and ascended to Heaven forty days later, May 13.

Place.—The lesson circles around the Mount of Olives near to Bethany, whence our Lord ascended.

LESSON HELPS.
The ascension of Jesus into heaven is one of the great facts in the history of his life, and completes the earthly work of the atonement. It is told in few words and without any expression of wonder. The voice of the angels dispelled all rising doubts, and the fact is joyfully received. Since then "he ever liveth to make intercession for us." Read in this connexion Luke 24. 44-53.

1. "The former treatise" or narrative of Luke's gospel. "Theophilus"—A friend of Luke, to whom he inscribed both the gospel which bears his name and the book of the Acts. "Both to do and teach"—To do by his miracles and to teach by his utterances, which were mainly in the form of parables and brief precepts.

2, 3. "Taken up" That is ascended into heaven through power divine.

"Through the Holy Ghost" richly dwelling in him, for in him dwell all the fullness of the Godhead bodily. "Had given commandments" such as are contained in verse 4. "After his passion"—Which means after his suffering, ending in the death on the cross. "Infallible proofs"—An event so important called for such proofs. The evangelists record nine appearances of Jesus during the forty days after the resurrection, and at one time he appeared to about five hundred persons. There could be no mistake as to the fact. "The kingdom of God"—That is, the kingdom of truth which Jesus came to confirm and enlarge.

4. "Not depart from Jerusalem"—Apart from this command the disciples might have left Jerusalem, because of the persecution which was aroused. This was the sacred city of the Jews where the sacrifices were offered, and was hallowed by the great sacrifice of the "Lamb of God." The prophecy was that from this city should go forth the word of the Lord. "Promise of the Father"—Which was that they should be clothed with power for their future work in building up the kingdom of God upon the earth.

5, 6. "John," the Baptist. The baptism of water was more proper, but this second baptism was more glorious and effective. "Not many days hence"—They had to wait, that faith might be tested and prayer arise, and so they would be prepared to receive the wonderful blessing.

"Restore again the kingdom to Israel"—The disciples wished the Jews to be free from the Roman power, and hoped that Jesus would deliver them. They were slow to see that the glory of his kingdom was in its spirituality.

7. "Not for you to know the times or the seasons"—He did not answer the question, but bade them be patient, for the Father would bring all his purposes to pass in his own time and way. Errors have crept into the church from attempts to fix the date when prophecies are to be fulfilled.

8. "Power"—To inspire them personally for their work and to make them as apostles—the earthly heads of a kingdom which would endure. "Witnesses unto me"—They were as witnesses first to know the great facts in the life of Christ, and then they were to have the courage to go forth and tell what they knew, even though the death of a martyr awaited them.

9. "He was taken up" He had just finished telling his disciples that they were to be witnesses, and then he arose and they saw him until a passing cloud hid from their sight.

10. "Two men"—Angel in nature, or at least in office. They seemed to appear suddenly, and mention is made of their white apparel. "Why stand ye gazing"—A question to rebuke their distrust, and then came a statement to comfort them. "Shall so come in like manner"—This teaches the second advent or coming of Christ and every eye shall see him. The disciples expected to see him during his own lifetime, but when he will come no one can tell. We should ever be ready.

The English strength is, however, swollen by many ships which in any foreign navy would be considered worthless and obsolete. For example, of our battleships ten are armed with antiquated muzzle-loading guns, fit only for the museum. Five of these ships are thirty years or more old, though in Germany every ship reckoned obsolete when she is more than twenty-five years old.

The return does not, of course, include this year's building proposals, or mention the British submarines that the admiralty has decided upon.
