The exhibit remains open for inspection should not be missed by those who are interested.

The historical and general description of the Island is well written and interesting, and the statistical information regarding the resources, zoology, government, etc., furnish much interesting data. A generous chapter is devoted to Prince Edward Island as a tourist resort, and should result in attracting trade beneficial to the province and its people. The book is splendidly illustrated and printed.

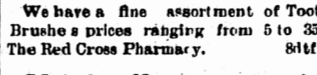
