"CAT AND MOUSE" ACT BELOW ESTIMATE LONDON, Jan. 17.—The Daily Mail says this morning that official figures show that the "Cat and Mouse" Act, under which militant suffragettes who start a hunger strike in jail are released, only to be arrested again when their health is restored, has broken up the militant cause.

"The paper points out that only 46 militants have been arrested in the nine months since the enactment of the law, while 240 were sent to jail previously. Only two are now in prison. Six completed their sentences or paid the alternative fine. Two were discharged on giving a pledge to behave. Thirty-seven fled from the country, while out of jail under the ticket-of-leave.

FOREMOST REPORTER OF MODERN TIMES ITHACA, N. Y., January, 17.—In a lecture on "The Citizen and the Press," at Cornell University today, Franklin Matthews, of the teaching staff of the Columbia University School of Journalism, characterized Captain Robert F. Scott, who lost his life in his Antarctic Polar expedition, as the "foremost reporter of modern times."

Scott, said the speaker, was born and lived and died a reporter, although Scott and the world never realized it. Scott's memory deserved to be England as high a monument as Nelson's," he declared. Mr. Matthews quoted Scott's dying words: "Those rough notes and our dead bodies must tell the tale," as a true epitome of the spirit of modern journalism.

AMERICAN CENTREBOARD WILL BE ADOPED LONDON, Jan. 17.—The Standard announces its belief, on good authority that most radical feature of Sir Thomas Lipton's Shamrock IV, will be the adoption of the American centreboard. This will be the first time in the history of British yachting that a craft has been fitted with a centreboard. The challenger will be the first yacht of this type to be sent across the Atlantic to compete for the America's Cup.

IN MEMORIAM

MRS. IDA L. CURRIE.

As already announced in The Guardian the death of Mrs. Ida L. Currie, occurred on Dec. 31st, at Haverhill, Mass. Mrs. Currie had been enjoying her usual health all along, till the night of the 30th, when she was suddenly taken ill; and though the best physicians in the city laboured strenuously for the next twenty-four hours to save her young life their efforts were of no avail to stay the visit of the Angel of Death; and on New Year's Eve, when the old year was slowly passing away, her pure bright spirit freed itself from its earthly prison and soared aloft to its home in the Paradise of God to be for ever with the Lord. Mrs. Currie, who was born in Farnscliffe in 1874 and was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Stephen Carrier, was greatly beloved for her kindness and pureness of heart, and her many sterling qualities and virtues by a large circle of friends in Haverhill, where she lived for so many years; friends who, when they heard of her death sent a token of their esteem and sorrow a profusion of the most beautiful flowers that could be procured in the city.

On Thursday, the 8th inst., the body was brought to Farnscliffe to the home of her mother, Mrs. Catherine Carrier; and on Friday afternoon, in the beautiful little cemetery of the English Church at Cherry Valley, and that was mortal of this one of the noblest and best women that ever lived was tenderly laid to rest alongside of where her father and sister Mary are sleeping their long last sleep.

The funeral services were conducted by Rev. David Jones, and the pallbearers comprised of four brothers-in-law of the deceased, and two nephews:—Messrs Daniel MacAulay, John McDonald, David and W. D. Sherrin, John S. Sherrin and Allan MacAulay.

To the sorrowing mother of the dear departed one in the loss of a kind and loving daughter, the sympathy and prayers of all goes out today; as well as to her six children: Bertha, Lucien, George, Adeline, Willard and Albert who have thus lost one of the most affectionate and devoted mothers that ever lived.
