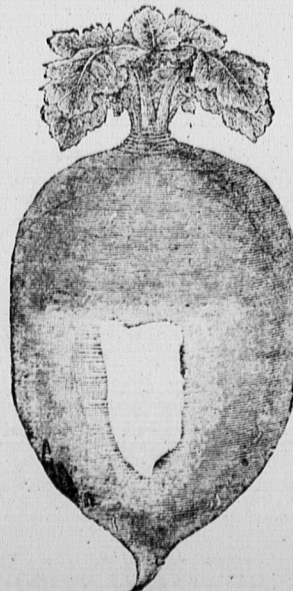

ESTRADA REPULSE MADRIZ TROOPS WITH HEAVY LOSS.

BLUEFIELDS, Nic., May 30—General Lara, commander of the Madriz forces, again attacked Gen. Estrada's positions yesterday. About 3 o'clock in the morning he began an assault on Estrada's left flank with five hundred men, but after hard fighting, in which many were killed and wounded, the Madriz troops were forced to retire. Estrada's losses are light.

ROOSEVELT AND ROOT CONFER IN LONDON.

LONDON, May 30—President Roosevelt had an opportunity today to hear something of affairs in the United States. By appointment he met Senator Root, who is passing through London on his way to The Hague. Mr. Roosevelt and his former secretary of state, had a long talk at Ambassador Reid's residence, Dorchester House. Asked for what interesting subject kept them together for so long a time, Mr. Roosevelt laughingly replied: "This is one of the cases in which I must observe my usual reticence."

TROLLEY SYSTEM TIED BY A STRIKE.

ALBANY, N. Y., May 30—The entire trolley system of the United Traction Company in Albany was tied up this morning by a strike. The strike was declared owing to a disagreement as to the Pennsalar trolley crew running their cars through Albany to the circus grounds. They claim this interferes with an agreement between them and the company.

The feature of the bill at the Fifth Avenue Theatre during the week of June 6th, will be the presentation of "Love's Understudy," a sketch of dramatic interest from the pen of Richard Fletcher, a budding playwright. The piece was produced some weeks ago at the Lyceum Theatre and so pronounced was the impression made that it was immediately snapped up for vaudeville. "Love's Understudy," from the title might seem an idyllic fantastic comedy offering, but it is a virile bit of pathos skillfully blended with moments of lighter interest. It is the story of the romance of a hat trimmer in a smart millinery shop and the precocious delivery boy. The moment is somewhat startling and cannot be spoiled by the telling in advance. "Love's Understudy" will be enacted by a smart little company consisting of Miss Ethel Browning, a favorite stock actress; Miss Winifred Voorhes, latterly with Mr. Pink, Gardiner, in "Evolution Nell," and Mr. Rockiffe Pollocks, of the Royal Belasco's forces. If Mr. Fletcher can equal his maiden effort, the American stage has much good in store for it. Second, on a big bill of nine acts, instead of the usual eight, will come, Warren, Lyon and Myers, in their prolific supply of mirth, melody, dancing and patter. These entertainers one year ago practically unknown, are now eagerly sought for. Belonging to the new school in vaudeville, they are ever on the alert and constant improvement is always noticeable in the manner in which they present their act to an audience. Next will come Albert Holtz, England's phenomenal boy soprano, a youth who with equal facility renders "The Lost Chord" or "Carrie Marry Harry." Simply riotous will be the scandalous doings of Dave Ferguson, the polite eruditor of gloom, who will make his vaudeville debut. Young Master Hoie will finish his act with a serious selection, while Ferguson is out to make the laugh creating record of the century. In the middle of the bill will come Welch, Mealy and Montrose in the ha-ha-ha absurdity, "Play Ball." One can no more describe "Play Ball" than one could count the stitches in a crazy quilt and what Welch, Mealy and Montrose will do to one's funny bone will be a subject of conversation for doctors only. The quality of the Fifth Avenue's bill may easily be judged when the rest of the program calls for Conroy, Le-maire and Co., in "A King for a Night," another smile extractor; the Amoros Sisters in a Parisian novelty act, new to these shores; Tony Wilson and Heloise, wonders on the horizontal bar, and that extra feature of merit, "The Old Soldier Fiddlers," a quartette of grizzled veterans of the Civil War, two of the Blue and two of the Gray. The doughty old warriors, once bitterest foes have laid aside all sectional feeling, and draw sweet memories of the olden days by their soul stirring rendition of familiar melodies of a bygone time. Motion pictures will round out a most worthy program.

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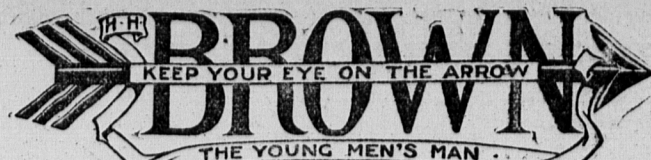

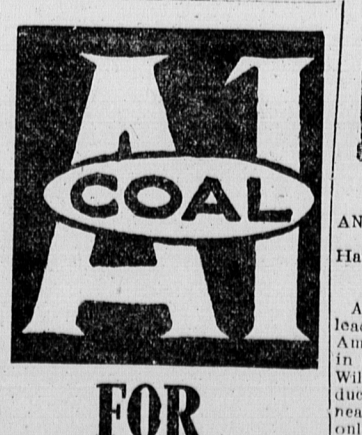

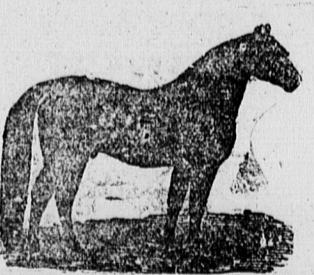
