RAILWAY AWARDS
WINNING, July 21.—Two hundred thousand railway workers in Canada will benefit to the same extent as United States railway employees by the award announced in Chicago today. It was estimated by one of the highest officials in Winnipeg the award will mean increases in wages aggregating \$70,000,000. In Canada, he said, a further increase in freight rates over and above the 30 per cent increase asked in the application presented by Canadian Railways last week, is necessitated by the award. It is not said how much more rates would have to be revised but it was hinted that the application might be revised to request a 45 per cent increase.
