THE FORESTRY CONVENTION.

A great Forestry Convention is to meet at Ottawa on the 10th, 11th and 12th of January instant, called by Sir Wilfrid Laurier under authority of Parliament at its last session.

"Canada possesses one of the largest areas of virgin forest of any country in the world and is reckoned by European experts first, or among the first of the important sources of the world's timber supply for the future."

The first day will be devoted to addresses by Sir Wilfrid Laurier and others, and a series of papers touching the Nation and the Forest and Forestry and Irrigation. The second day will be devoted to Forestry in Relation to Agriculture.

The concluding day will cover The Relation of our Forests to our Other Industries. Few have paused to consider how close and intimate are our relations to the forest.

THE NEW YEAR AND PEACE.
