

General Motors was off 1-4 and Chrysler up 1-2.

Climax-Molybdenum, General Gas & Electric preferred and Commonwealth & Southern preferred pushed into new high ground for the day. Modest improvement was retained by American Machine & Metal, Santa Fe, Great Northern, N.Y. Shipbuilding, Newport News Shipbuilding, Electric Boat, Wesson Oil, Chickasha Oil, Glidden, Continental Baking "A", Aviation Corp., United Aircraft, Glenn Martin, Curtiss-Wright, U. S. Rubber, Western Union and American Smelting.

Revere Copper & Brass preferred was up 5 1-4. The company reported net of \$2.52 a common share for 1940 versus 19 cents in 1939. The common lost a fraction.

Douglas Aircraft suffered a net loss of 3 points. Moderately in arrears were N. Y. Central, Standard Oil of N.J., American Can, Consolidated Edison, American Telephone and Phelps Dodge.

### NOTICE

The following is a copy of Section No. 1 of the By-law regulating and compelling the Removal of Snow and Ice from off the Sidewalks:—

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:—

It shall be the duty of every tenant or occupier of any premises in the City, or in case there be no tenant, then of the owner of such premises to keep such portion of any public walk as shall be immediately in front of such premises free from snow at all times except that it shall be sufficient to have the same free from snow four hours after the ceasing of any snow storm, if such ceases in the daytime, or if in nighttime then before ten o'clock in the day time following; and further to keep such portion of public walk free from ice at all reasonable times, otherwise to cover the same with sand, ashes or other material sufficient to give safe footing.

The attention of all property owners in the City is drawn to the above section.
