BETTER IN SPOTS.—Mr McManus, mail carrier between Charlottetown and Hampton, reports a great improvement in the roads through New Haven, Clyde River and Cornwall. The roadmasters in these sections have turned out their men as occasion demanded after the recent sudden changes in the weather with the result that their roads are a credit to them. In Bonshaw, Green Road and DeSable, it is far otherwise, the roads being simply disgraceful and dangerous. In DeSable, through the neglect of those who should have broken the roads, Mr McManus lost a valuable horse after the last big snowstorm and he does not want a similar experience. This condition should not be allowed to continue any longer. If the roadmasters persist in their neglect to the disgrace and the inconvenience of these localities, some action should be taken either by the people themselves or by the mail carrier. He is expected to deliver his mails daily, but he is not supposed to risk his life or that of his horse in doing so.

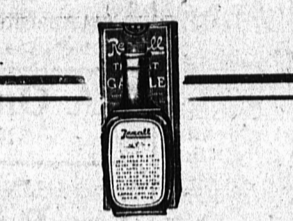
