Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

The sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but a Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after entering homestead; also 30 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 30 acres and erect a house worth \$3.00. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

there are other more important matters to be dealt with he would pass on to something else.

"Now," resumed the speaker, "we come to a very serious charge. The hon. Leader of the Opposition rose in his place and charged the Premier with having put, to quote his words, 'his unholy hands' into the Treasury and made use of funds that were not voted, and he charged me with being the recipient of those funds. He charged the whole Government with the commission of a terrible crime. One would think that a man of his experience and responsibility would, before he made such a charge, at least look up the records and speak with a little authority. Before attempting to make such a serious charge, he should know something of what he was speaking about. I would ask him if he has ever looked at the estimates in past years? Has he ever gone to the trouble to verify his assertion that these moneys were taken 'by unholy hands and without authority'? I think it will become a man in his position to show his ignorance in that way, through neglect to acquaint himself with the facts of the matter on which he attempts to speak. If he would refer to the estimates in five minutes which he could obtain in five minutes—he would see that there was authority for the use of the money, which was voted in the supply bill. If he has any doubt in the matter I advise him to go yet and be educated. I am sorry that I have to speak on a delicate matter of this kind, which concerns myself, but that by the Leader of the Opposition—a charge which he cannot justify and which he would never have made if he were an honourable gentleman. For his benefit and for the benefit of some of the hon. members, I think it might be within my province to give an account of

this way. The hon. member for Georgetown, in the discussion a day or two ago, said the time will come when this iniquitous Gerrymander Bill will produce its own punishment. I say to you, Mr Speaker, the time has arrived when these hon. gentlemen are beginning to have the first instalment of the punishment which is justly to be meted out to them for their iniquities in the past. The hon. Leader of the Opposition says this reconstruction smells like a gerrymander. I would take it and I would thrust it under the hon. gentleman's nose and would say to him: "Smell it. Take a good whiff of it, until you begin to understand what is meant by the brimstone you have manufactured for your political opponents." Metaphorically speaking, I would take hold of the hon. member for New Perth, draw down his chin, and open that great cavity of his. I would take a great pill—a gerrymander pill—and would thrust it down that open mouth and say to that hon. gentleman, does it hurt? Do you feel it? Does it make you squint? Does it agitate you and make you throw your arms about? Does it produce a volume of noise and angry gesticulations? Does it give you a pain in the bowels? If it does I would ram it home and say, take it and may it do you good, operate in your constitution and exercise its proper functions until such time as you begin to understand that the Liberals of this country have rights which you and your party are bound to respect. I say, Mr Speaker, I am ready in this matter to preach not the doctrine of submission, but that of defiance.
"How do you like that from a member of the Opposition?" asked Mr Dalton.

THE PREMIER: He is not a bit better now than he was then. (Laughter.)

Hon. Mr DALTON: Here we have a record of the language of this gentleman. Any man who uttered a speech like that is unworthy to sit in this House! And he would sit over it too. Instead of joining with the hon. province in appreciation of the work in connection with the institution and all that we have done, the hon. gentleman has nothing but base ingratitude to offer. Is there any charity in a man who would bring a charge like this, in fact and which the hon. gentleman must have known to be false? I would quote the following passage from St Paul on charity, which is rightly said to be the greatest of the three virtues: Faith, hope and charity:—
"Listen to what St Paul says:—
"Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels and have not Charity, I am become as sounding brass or a tinkling bell, and though I have the gift of prophecy and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and though I have all faith, and have not Charity, I am nothing."
Do you catch the sequence of St Paul's observation? If you have not Charity, you are no more than a cracked bell at a 10c circus. You are the cube-root of a vacuum; the net product of nothing. St Paul says so, and the gentleman from Damascus was usually correct in his conclusions.
Mr BELL: You are not quoting the "last expression?"
Mr DALTON: No; it is not necessary to quote further. It is sufficient that line would suit the pitiable case of the hon. gentleman. All I would say is, that if he is not ashamed of himself he ought to be.
