FIELDING AND WELDON

Hon. W. S. Fielding, Finance Minister of Canada, now seeking reelection in the counties of Queen's and Shelburne, is to be opposed by Dr. R. C. Weldon, Professor of Constitutional Law, Dalhousie University. The two counties which form the constituency lie side by side and look out upon the broad Atlantic. There are no large towns within their borders. The people are mainly farmers and fishermen, and number but some 25,000 in the two counties, having diminished by 1,000 between 1891 and 1901. Queen's and Shelburne has been represented by Mr. Fielding since his first entry into the arena of federal politics in 1896. The election results from his being unseated for illegal practices by his agents in the election of 1904.

Hon. William Stevens Fielding is of English lineage and was born in Halifax in November, 1818. Dr. Richard Chapman Weldon was born in Sussex, New Brunswick in January 1849. It will be seen that the opposed candidates are very nearly of equal age. When he was sixteen years of age Mr. Fielding left school to enter the employ of the Halifax Chronicle and before he was out of his teens he was writing its editorials. He was connected with that journal for twenty years, down to 1884. He was elected to the House of Assembly for Halifax county in 1882, and very shortly after was a member of the Government and in 1891 became Premier, which position he held until he became Finance Minister of Canada in 1896.

Dr. Weldon received his early education in Sussex, taught school for a time, and afterwards completed his studies at Mount Allison, Yale and Heidelberg, studying international law at the latter. (B. A. 1896; M. A. 1870; D. C. L., 1883). He was professor of Mathematics in Mount Allison, 1875-83 since when he has been Professor of Constitutional Law and Dean of the Law of Faculty at Dalhousie University, Halifax. He represented Albert County, N. B. in the House of Commons from 1887 to 1896 when he was defeated. In Parliament he won a high reputation as a speaker and was rapidly coming to the front. Sir John Macdonald jocularly named him "A. Jax."

Mr. Fielding is widely known for his ability and resource as a speaker and writer and as second only to Sir Wilfrid in his influence in the Liberal party. Dr. Weldon is one of the brightest and ablest men in the Conservative party. But we cannot regard their chances of election as at all equal. Nova Scotia at the general election two years ago rejected every Conservative candidate, and it must be conceded that a by-election, now, against a strong and popular Minister of the

Government must give an Opposition candidate nothing better than a forlorn hope. This is the task which Dr. Weldon has pluckily undertaken. Of course, if by any chance he can succeed in winning the seat it will be a great victory. On the other hand his anticipated defeat, should it be realized, will not be necessarily disheartening.

A leading Ontario journal notes a steady advance in the value of farm property in various sections of that Province. This is a favorable symptom. With it there has come an advance of rents in cities.

The perils that beset the submarine torpedo boat even in time of peace are many. These craft have not yet been used in actual warfare, but already two French and three British submarines have been lost with almost all on board.

Secretary Taft seems to have managed affairs in Cuba with great tact and skill and has quickly pacified the distracted little republic for the time. How long the now established order and quiet will be maintained may be a matter of speculation, but no mistake seems to have been made in the work of restoring peace quickly. The big secretary has gained new laurels in Cuba.

The Toronto Globe gravely discusses the advisability of disfranchising London, Ont. for a series of years. This is the English method, and The Globe says it may be necessary to introduce it in Canada. This is all very well as far as it goes. But who profited by the corruption in London? Clearly it was the Liberal party and its Minister of Public Works who were elected by corrupt means. Ought the party and the Minister to retain the spoils they won by bribery, ballot switching and perjury? The Globe is a little shy on this aspect of the case.

The discovery of a vast new coalfield in England is one of the unexpected things that are happening nowadays. It comes long after all the mineral wealth of the British Isles was supposed to be known and in large part exploited, and long after the exhaustion of the coal supply had become a subject of serious speculation. The new find is said to be worth a thousand millions, and the discovery of this vast field of virgin coal is said to be "an event of the most importance for the district since the Norman conquest." It lies mainly in Kent County, southwest of London.
