### Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300. The area is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

I know that he was brave as I have been with him for three months under very trying circumstances and know that he never once showed anything but the best discipline and obedience to orders.

If Corporal Steele had lived he certainly would in a short time received permission as I fully appreciated his wit and liked him very much.

I sympathize deeply with you, but I know that he thought he died doing his duty will comfort you in your sorrow, and that why I write this letter.

### ISLANDER KILLED HIS LAST LETTER HOME

Mr. Wm. Dickson of Gasperaux, has been notified by telegram of the death of his son Private Edward Dickson, who was killed in action on May 17th 1916. The following is a copy of the last letter written home by this brave young islander who willingly gave his life to keep the old flag flying:

**BELGIUM,** May 9th 1916.

Dear Father:—Just a few lines to let you know I received your ever welcome letter and glad to hear from home also glad to hear mother and the boys are well. The wound I got in the left fore arm. It was not serious, it being a flesh wound. I was in the hospital six weeks, but now I am back to not so good as home, but someone has to keep the old flag flying so all the boys are trying to do their part. When you get this letter be sure to write and tell me all the news and who all enlisted from home I am about the same as when I left home. There will be a good time when this is over and all the boys come home, that is, if any of us live to come, but we must take our chances. I suppose the family is growing big since I saw them, but many a time I think of you all. Well news is scarce with me so I will now ring off. Hoping to hear from you soon as time will allow a letter to come, so I remain, your ever loving son, with love to mother and all.

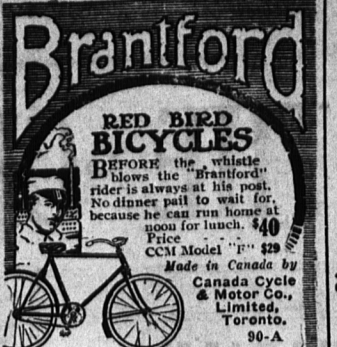
