32 BODIES HAVE BEEN RECOVERED

VICTORIA, B. C., Oct 10—The last of the bodies that were entombed in No 2 mine at Extension were brought out this morning, when the corpses of Herman Peterson and Mike Deucolovitch were added to the 30 others previously brought out. Official investigation into the causes of the disaster by Inspectors Sheppard and Dick began this morning. The consensus of opinion is that a blown out shot in 22 stall caused the explosion of coal dust.

MONTREAL TO HAVE A WINTER CARNIVAL

MONTREAL, Oct 10—In spite of recent denials, Montreal is to have another winter carnival, probably in the second week of January, and arrangements are already being made to make it a success. A member of last year's committee states definitely that an ice palace larger than the last will be constructed, and that no opposition is expected this time from sources which were bitterly against the carnival last winter.

BALTIMORE COLLEGE STUDENTS IN SCRAP

BALTIMORE, Md., Oct. 10—There were hostilities all along the line between the freshmen and sophomores at local colleges today, and the engagements were among the most strenuous ever known here.

At the College of Physicians and Surgeons the freshmen were covered with flour and then converted into dough balls by a liberal application of water. Many suits of clothes were ruined and two arrests made by the police.

At John Hopkins University the class rush was cooled off by the authorities, but the freshmen and sophomores got together and smashed noses and broke up furniture. Dean Griffin quelled the disturbance without calling in the police, whom he had in waiting.

At the university of Maryland there was a general scrimmage.

At the college of Physicians and Surgeons, a riot call was turned in and police reserves were rushed to the scene. For two hours the students held the building, hooting and jeering at the policemen. The streets were blocked with an immense crowd.

The police charged the main entrance again and again, but without gaining entrance. Prof. Simon was caught in the conflict between the classes and soaked to the skin. Then a paper sack of flour hit him and he was covered from head to foot.

REV. THOS. MARSHALL GETS LARGER FIELD

ST. JOHN, Oct. 10—The Board of Methodist Missions have added Nova Scotia to the inspection field of Rev. Thomas Marshall who has been for some time superintendent of missions in New Brunswick and Newfoundland. Rev. Mr. Marshall was for several years pastor of Carmarthen street and Queen Square Methodist churches in this city, and has always taken a prominent part in temperance work in New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island. He was appointed a member of the prohibition commission some years ago by the local government to investigate the Prince Edward Island law.

CHARGES FLUNG IN POLAR CONTROVERSY

COPENHAGEN, Oct 10—Captain C. E. Borchgrevink, the Atlantic explorer, who wintered in the Southern Polar region in 1900, and is about to undertake another expedition there, has expressed his opposition to the proposed submission of Dr Cook's records to the university here, and to the committee of the American Geographical Society. Captain Borchgrevink declared that this procedure will not prove satisfactory, because he considers that both bodies are prepossessed in favor of Dr Cook. He suggests that the Geographical Society of Geneva, as an unprejudiced body, should be asked to settle the matter.

A Greenland clergyman named Ludwigg, who is a member of the Cape York Mission, and is acquainted with Dr Cook, and Commander Peary, has opened a campaign against the latter, reiterating some old allegations as to his ill-treatment of the Eskimos. Among other charges, he alleges that Commander Peary once deserted a band of women and children on the ice without food, because they hindered the rapid advance of his expedition.

WASHINGTON, Oct 10—The original tidal records and profile of soundings from Columbia to the North Pole will be sent soon by Commander Peary to the Coast and Geodetic Survey here, according to a telegram received today from him, dated South

Harpwell, Me. LOWELL, Mass., Oct 10—In an interview General A. W. Greely, the Arctic explorer, expressed the opinion that both Cook and Peary reached the Pole.

CHARGES AGAINST REVENUE CUTTER

VICTORIA, B.C., Oct 10—A serious charge is made by returned sealers against the United States revenue cutter Bear, which intercepted the Victoria sealing schooners Jessie, Thomas F. Bayard, and Pescaawa, and sealed up their firearms on June 23rd in the North Pacific ocean over twenty-seven miles from nearest territorial waters. It is claimed the action was planned at the instance of San Francisco sea other dealers for the purpose of breaking up the season of the local schooners. Formal protest at Washington will be entered.

DELEGATES SUSPENDED FOR ONE MONTH

TORONTO, Oct 10—The district labor council last night suspended the delegates of the local electrical workers' union for one month because of the failure of the union to pay its per capita tax for the past three months.

Local Union 353 voluntarily withdrew their delegates from the labor council pending the action of the approaching convention of the American Federation of Labor at which the electrical workers' trouble is to be discussed.

IMMIGRATION TO CANADA.

OTTAWA, Oct 11—During August the total immigration into Canada was 15,387, compared with 10,082 for the same month of last year. The arrivals from the United States numbered 8,924 compared with 1908, an increase of 71 per cent. The arrivals by Ocean ports totalled 7,363 compared with 5,398 for August last year, an increase of 36 per cent. The total immigration into Canada for the first five months of the present fiscal year show an increase of 15 per cent. over the same period of last year, when the arrivals numbered 39,385.

CARNEGIE GIVES \$100,000 TO MCGILL UNIVERSITY.

MONTREAL, Oct 11—Andrew Carnegie has given \$100,000 to McGill University. The money was to go towards the general fund of \$200,000 which the friends of the University started to raise some months ago.

A NEW APPOINTMENT MADE.

OTTAWA, Oct. 11—Thomas Cote, Chief Editor of La Presse, Montreal, will be appointed Deputy Minister of Marine and Fisheries. The office has been vacant since the retirement of Col. Gordeau.

Cote was at one time assistant Census commissioner, and lately occupied the position of Secretary of the Canadian section of the Waterways Commission.
