ENTER SLANDER ACTION. MOOSE JAW, Sask., April 12—As the result of a statement made at a meeting of the real estate men on Thursday evening last, two reporters on the Morning News have instituted an action for slander against C. E. Brown, the publicly commissioner, who came here from Medicine Hat last September. He accused them of taking money from the National Land Company in connection with the erection here of a lined oil mill. That any consideration was paid to the two men is denied by them, and also by the local manager of the company, as well as by the president, who came up here from Calgary in connection with the lined oil mill. The land company has offices in Winnipeg, Calgary, Lethbridge, Saskatoon, Edmonton, Nelson and many other places. The damage claimed by the reporters is \$10,000 and the case is attracting considerable interest here. (Mr. Brown referred to is known in this Province.)

HEROINE PLUNGES INTO RIVER, SAVING LITTLE GIRL'S LIFE. PORTSMOUTH, N. H., April 12—Miss Merle Proir, a nineteen-year-old graduate of the Portsmouth High School made a brave and successful rescue of a little child at noon today. Miss Proir was walking along the banks of the Piscataqua River at Newington in company with Amelia Garland, four years old. The child suddenly slipped on a rock and fell into the river, which at this point is 10 to 12 feet deep. Throwing aside her wraps, Miss Proir jumped above the child and keeping its head above water brought the frightened but otherwise uninjured little one to the bank. Miss Proir is soon to study for the profession of nurse in a Boston hospital.

MAINE BOY IS SHOT BY HIS OWN RIFLE. WOOLWICH, Me., April 12—The first gunning fatality of the season occurred here when Harry Savage, 16-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Savage, was almost instantly killed by the discharge of a gun he was drawing toward him from a boat.
