Busy Scenes At Red Cross Clinic

No one who happened to visit the Red Cross rooms here yesterday could fail to be moved by the visible evidence of a wonderful job being competently done. This is with reference to the semi-annual clinic for crippled children which was conducted by Dr. Acker, orthopedic specialist of Halifax, under the auspices of the Red Cross Society. From many different points on Prince Edward Island, people streamed into Charlottetown by car, bus and train; many busy and anxious but eager that their children should benefit from this wonderful opportunity for free examination and advice by an expert. During the greater part of the day the Society's rooms presented an almost steady panorama of fathers and mothers arriving with children of all ages from babies in their mothers' arms to boys and girls in their teens. Many of the cases which consulted with Dr. Acker at this time were old ones that had been receiving treatment for some time. Improvement was very marked especially in cases which had been brought to the clinic in the early stages of their condition. Many other cases were new ones and the sight of these children being brought for the first time under the eye of an expert could not help but impress any onlooker with the wonderful idea back of these Red Cross Clinics. The importance of inspired and enthusiastic public support. When it is taken into consideration that for many of the children born in this province it is not only the first, but possibly the only opportunity they would ever have of receiving a specialist's advice it cannot help but be realized that public consciousness of this work, and co-operation with it, is of vital importance in the interests of healthy Canadian citizenship. The patients brought to Dr. Acker present widely different types of case histories. Some are serious conditions caused by paralysis and tuberculosis. Some cases are in need of operation. Others are due to nervous disorders and may be cured or improved by proper and early home treatment. Such treatment when necessary is carefully explained at the clinic. With so much of the happiness and future usefulness of these children hanging in the balance it is of importance, in the first place, that the parents of the children should realize that such service is available, and, in the second place, that this work receive the understanding and help of charitable people.
