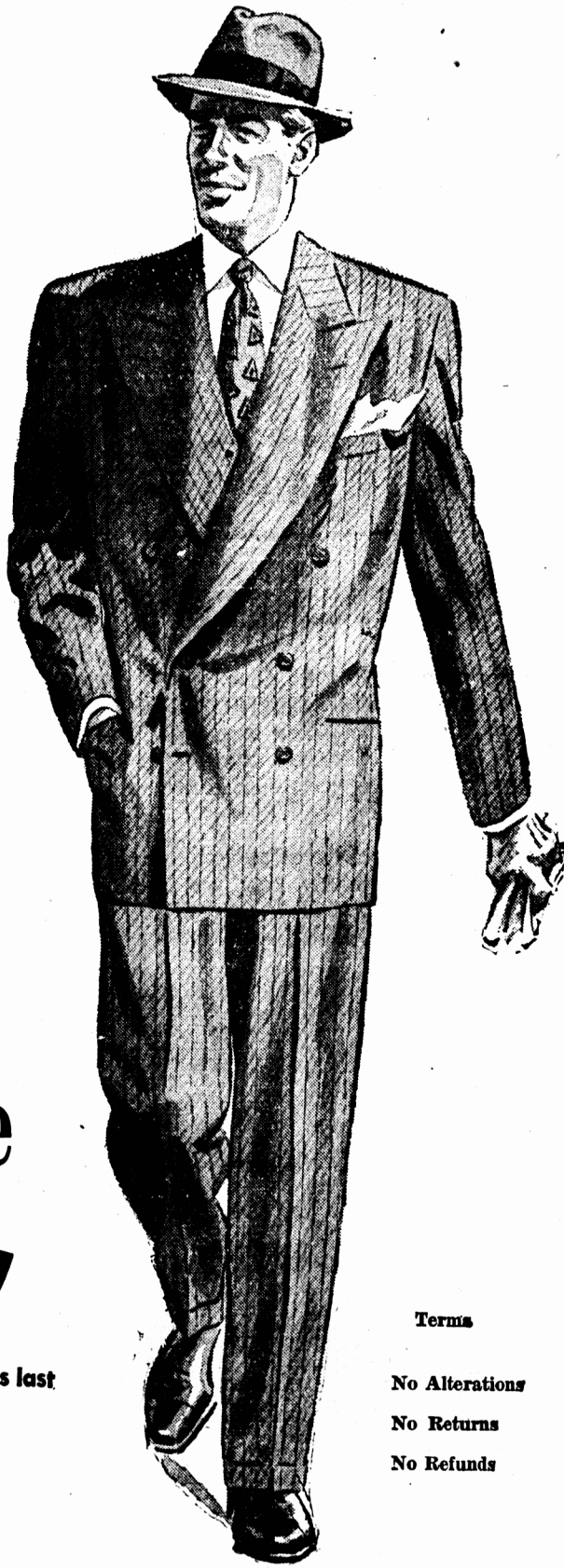

It was perhaps the greatest livestock drive ever attempted and brought to a successful finish not even excepting the great drive of Alberta cattle by the late Barrett Henderson and other islanders to Dawson City in 1898 or 1899. — K
