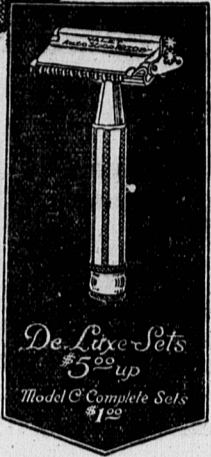

Millions Expended On Motor Highways

OTTAWA, April 28.—During the year 1926 a total of \$45,563,000 was spent on construction and maintenance of all Provincial highways in Canada, according to computations made by A. W. Campbell, Dominion Highway Commissioner, and \$15,978,000 on maintenance of highways already constructed. The total mileage of roads involved in his aggregate expenditure was 46,821 miles.

The total mileage of highways constructed in Canada in 1926 was 5,783, and the largest mileage in any Province was New Brunswick with a total of 1,004, older Ontario with 859, Northern Ontario with 523 miles; Quebec with 718, Manitoba with 665, Alberta with 652 (of which 273 was colonization roads), Saskatchewan with 480, British Columbia with 303, Nova Scotia with 252 and Prince Edward Island with 30 miles.

Quebec is Second

Quebec was next with a total of \$6,170,000, of which \$3,170,000 was spent on construction and \$2,000,000 on maintenance, the total mileage being 3,858.

Edmund Jones, His Lordship states that conviction should have been registered in the police court in prosecutions against Hubert Pocock, osteopath, and W. I. Ellison, chiropractor. The use of the word by those who are not registered surgeons or physicians under the Ontario Medical Act is held to be illegal.
