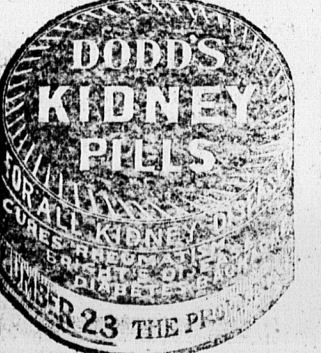

TWO MEN KILLED IN SPRINGHILL MINE

HALIFAX, N. S., March 24.—A fall of coal in the Springhill coal mine killed two men, James Graham and Hector MacKenzie. The fall occurred on Friday but the fact that the two men were under the coal was not known till yesterday when they were found after a search. One man who was working only twenty feet away did not know of the accident. The coal was about several hours after the men had come out of the mine the absence of Graham and MacKenzie was noticed. A search was made where the pile of fallen coal was discovered, and after twelve hours digging the bodies were discovered. An inquest is being held which today adjourned till Wednesday.

All are in sub-division B of the third division of the civil service.

DOMINIONS AND IMPERIAL DEFENCE

LONDON, March 23.—Replying to Page Croft, M. P., on the question of Dominions' representation in naval councils, the First Lord said it was not for the British Admiralty to initiate such a proposal. He would give the Dominions every assistance in the development of their unit fleets in harmony with the best conceptions of naval policy. He himself was not so optimistic with regard to the difficulty of associating Ministers of self-governing Dominions with in consultation upon Imperial defence in this country. Those difficulties, however, were becoming less, and the Committee of Imperial Defence might yet be the medium for establishing intimate connections with all parts of the Empire.

VICTORIA MUSEUM TOWER, OTTAWA, SAID TO BE SINKING.

OTTAWA, March 23.—That the main tower on the Victoria Museum is sinking at the rate of about an inch a month, the resultant crack widening at a proportionate rate, was the statement made by one of the officials employed in the building this morning. We have kept a record since last May, said he, of the way the crack has been widening, and the figure is that the tower is sinking about that much. On the third floor of the building a section of the tiled flooring has sunk several inches. The grating crack which runs from top to bottom of the structure is now branching out into numerous smaller fissures.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made by any Agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties: Six months his residence upon and cultivation of the land, in each of three years. A homesteader must live on a farm, at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$300 per acre. Duties: Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry including the time required to earn homestead money and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead.
