(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, Nov. 19.—Egg prices eased on Montreal open produce market today following receipt of fresh arrivals.

Graded shipments of eggs in carlots or less were quoted at 38 to 39 cents a dozen for A-large, 34 to 35 cents for A-medium, 32 to 33 cents for A-pullet, 27 to 28 cents for B-large, 25 1/2 to 26 cents for B-medium, 24 to 24 1/2 cents for C.

Receipts were composed of 162 cattle, 24 sheep and lambs, 660 hogs and 48 calves. Steers sold at prices ranging from \$1.50 for those of light common quality, to \$5.25 for a small lot of steers of medium good quality.
