ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years of age, may head a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district, must appear in person at the agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of the land.
