MARITIME TRADE—According to the Bank of Montreal report for August 22, wholesale and retail trade continued at a high level and sales compare favourably with a year ago notwithstanding short-ages in various lines. Tourist trade is brisk with a boom reported in Nova Scotia. Collections are good. Sawmills are active. Demand for wood products of all kinds continues strong; prices are high. The dried fish market is strong; it is expected that last year's controlled prices will be maintained for the 1947 production. Demand for fresh fish is poor and prices are weak. Leading fish companies are considering a price cut, a reduction in staff and a temporary closing of some plants. Manufacturing plants are well employed. Shipyards and ship-building plants in Nova Scotia are busy. The shipyards in Saint John N. B. are seriously affected due to lack of orders, and only key men are retained on the payroll. Coal production in Cape Breton during July was considerably higher than during the same period of 1946.

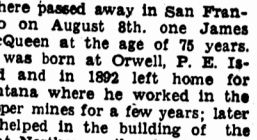
