The latest news, first of all.

The annual meeting of the shareholders of the Montague Electric Co. will be held on Wednesday, June 16, at 10 a.m. in the hall, which appears elsewhere.

Dealers in Souris are paying fifty cents a bus for oats, thirty-six cents a bus for potatoes, twenty-eight cents a bus for butter, eighteen cents a dozen for eggs, fifteen cents a ton for hay and six and a half cents a lb for beef.

In Montague dealers are paying thirty-eight to forty cents a bus for oats, twenty-two to twenty-five cents a bus for potatoes, fifteen cents a dozen for eggs, ten fifty a ton for loose hay, ten and a half cents a ton for pork, twenty to twenty-two cents a lb for butter and eight to nine cents a lb for hides.

HORSE NOTES.

During the absence from the Province of Jakez Lea his stallion Brown Mack will be at the stables of Jack Lea, Tryon.

Three of the finest cart stallions perhaps ever seen together in Canada were seen last Tuesday on the Market Square—Orphan Jack, owned by J. Watts, Hampshire, Lot 31, Island bred, weight 2,675; Wigton Hero, owned by a company in St. Peter's, imported, weight 1,910; Glucos, a pure bred Percheron, imported from France, owned by a Mr. Cook and in charge of that veteran horseman, Robert Heffel, weight 2,000 lbs. These horses are in the pink of condition, which goes to show that the grooms in charge fully understand

their business. I have judged in the show ring, on several occasions in the different Provinces, and I must admit I never yet saw three such animals together, all three possessing action equal to a good hackney.
