SPELLING REVIEWS

A plan that has worked well in ungraded schools is to have every word misspelled written on the board and the list left until Friday morning. Let one of the older pupils, who writes clearly, put the words up before school each day from the list furnished by the teacher. On Friday, when spelling review comes, let the same boy or girl erase the words from the board and give the teacher a fair copy, with the words numbered. The words may then be given out for oral or written spelling. On Monday morning, the words misspelled in review are put on the board again with a "2" after each, signifying that a double mark will be lost if they are spelled wrongly again. The deducted mark will be doubled each week, and in this way the common mistakes are hunted down and overcome. All pupils above Grade IV should take the review together, but the younger ones need not take more than the first twenty or thirty words, if the list is a long one.

INTERESTING HORSE NEWS

The horse show which will take place in the latter part of March promises to be of exceptional interest in view of the number of standard-bred stallions which will be shown and which will include Mayor Todd, Bottom, Captain Athreyn and others. Classes for heavy horses are expected to be exceptionally well filled, and the whole show will no doubt be one of unusual interest.

A catalogue of the mid-winter sale in New York has just been received by the Canada Fox Exchange. Offerings this year were smaller in number and inferior in quality than in former years. The prices realised were higher than ever, showing that the demand for harness horses with some speed is growing every year.

The Ice Racing Association are looking forward with eagerness to an anticipated thaw which will render the ice fit for racing. There are several events yet to be decided and sportsmen are anxious that they should be pulled off. The expected meeting of Car Ferry and Vesta Boy with the local horses is exciting keen interest in ice racing circles.

At the recent New York horse sale representative buyers of nearly all European countries were present. They bought some of the most expensive stock sold there. Europe seems to have adopted light harness racing, and the purses offered there would put to shame those of the largest American and Canadian meetings. As many as one hundred thousand persons witness the races there. The future of the trotter is made much brighter by reason of the active interest which these countries are taking in racing. The Imperial stables of Russia are among the largest and best equipped in the world and contain, among others, the celebrated stallion Baden, 2.061. This horse was bought for \$300,000 last year. Most of the horses are of American strain, and racing tracks are becoming popular features in the larger cities. England is not so prominent as some of the other European countries in the matter of harness racing, but a movement is on foot to establish tracks in some of the larger centres.

There is contemplated the establishment of a Maritime Racing Circuit, which will take in the principal towns such as Charlottetown, Sydney, Halifax, Moncton, Fredericton, St. Stephen, etc. This will give the owners of horses an opportunity of "commingling" them throughout the summer months.
