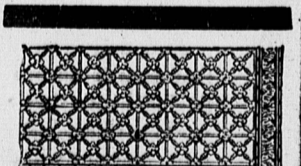

### THE PRINCE OF WALES AT CHURCH

"Many interesting sidelights on the Prince of Wales' tour are gradually being revealed through the letters of missionaries. One incident related in a letter from the Bishop of Accra is particularly significant. At Comasie, on the Gold Coast, the Prince went to St. Cyril's Church on Good Friday, and on Easter Sunday made his communion at Holy Trinity Church, Accra. At this service he received the Blessed Sacrament at the hands of an African native priest, and the Gold Coast Independent concluded its account of the service by saying 'We believe this is the first time that His Royal Highness and for the matter of that, any of the kings who have sat on the British Throne, has received communion at the hands of an African. It contains a tremendous significance which cannot be sufficiently gauged at the moment.'—The Guardian England.
