York Loan Co., investors here will be interested in the following from an exchange: As liquidators of the York County Loan, the National Trust Company, Toronto, sent out 102,800 cheques to persons all over the world, some having been directed to China, Japan, Australia, France and Sweden, while share-holders have returned from their temporary homes in Canada. The amount of the dividend was 9741,000, and the immense mass of postal matter required over \$1,500 in postage. There are still several thousand shareholders who have never turned in their books, and who consequently received nothing. There is some \$150,000 reserved for them in case their books turn up.

A recent issue of the Canadian Farn has the following: The wholesale quotations on butter are up 1 cent on last week's prices. First class butter is exceedingly scarce just now, and demand is keener than has been known for some time. All markets report an active butter trade, and a good many quote best deliveries at 32 cents. New York and Chicago prices have not changed, although there is certainly a tightening up on prices, as a scarcity of goodtable stuff is being keenly felt. Cheese is worth about 15¢ to 15 1/2 cents per lb. Demand is only fairly good, yet owing to a scarcity of deliveries the prices have risen a little on that of a week ago; about 1c. on twins. Butter is not going down yet. It will not be surprising to see another two cents added for next week's quotations.
