THE CHARLOTTETOWN EXHIBITION.

The annual exhibition at Charlottetown, open to the Maritime Provinces is now looked forward to not only as a pleasant yearly outing for our farmers, but as one of the best means of acquiring additional and valuable knowledge in regard of their life calling. No one interested in agriculture and desiring to learn can attend the display of the very best live stock, and the best exhibits of farm products generally without receiving great benefit.

This year the Exhibition Directors have gone further than heretofore by obtaining the services of experts in various lines to explain to our farmers the kind of animals to select when purchasing, the food with which to feed them, the best methods of cultivating their lands to produce this food and best manner of feeding it. This course will be found especially instructive and valuable.

They have also procured the services of experts in the growth of fruits and have provided a hall on the exhibition grounds to be called the Farmers' Pavilion, in which these experts will deliver lectures on various subjects of agricultural interest. Here our farmers will be invited to receive instruction, to rest and read the papers which will be provided and to ask questions pertaining to the various subjects discussed. Such ques-

Other amusements also in front of the grand stand will be provided and the people may expect this year to see the best exhibition ever held here, the best racing and the finest amusements.

An article of J. F. Crowdy, classical master of Upper Canada College, which appeared in The College Times has attracted much attention in the British press including the London Times. Mr. Crowdy's article deals with imperial education, the central idea being that those British persons intending to make a career in Canada should begin young and complete their education at the excellent schools and colleges of this country. The young man would in this way not only receive an education better suited to the conditions of Canadian life than he could get in the British Isles, but would acquire at the same time a knowledge of the country and an acquaintance with the people which would be most valuable. Among other most prominent persons Sir Charles Tupper has warmly commended Mr. Crowdy's interesting proposal.
