ELIZA McLAUGHLAN.

There are cases where the "King of terror" seems to be transformed into an emancipating angel, but when he comes into a home and takes away one in the blossom of youth, he then deserves his ancient title. This he did when he came to the home of John and Orphella McLaughlin of Clyde River, and caught away the spirit of their daughter Eliza on Wednesday June 19th. Although it was feared she would not successfully contend with the disease she was suffering from, yet her death came at last with a sudden surprise and plunged the neighbourhood into a cloud of sorrow. Eliza was in her twentieth year. She was baptised and became a member of the Baptist Church when about 15 years of age. She was a faithful member of the C. E. Society which could not, on the evening of her death, hold its session for very grief. There was a large gathering of relatives and friends at the funeral on the following Friday. Rev. E. P. Calder of Tryon her former pastor gave wise words of counsel to present pastor, Rev. McLeod. Presbyterian was also present. She is much missed from the home, church and neighbourhood.

There passed away at Glen Wilham, Lot 63, on April 18th, one whose life spent largely in that community had made him very well and very favourably known. Alexander MacDonald was a man of small stature, but of large and loving heart, and his sudden demise caused a deep and abiding feeling of sorrow among his many friends. On Tuesday morning he went to work in his usual health at the mill operated by his nephew, John MacDonald. Before noon he was stricken with a very severe pain and assisted to his nephew's dwelling house nearby, where although given the attention of the best medical skill, he breathed his last on Wednesday night.

Mr. MacDonald was seventy-two years of age at the time of his death, being predeceased seventeen years ago by his wife. Two sons, Charles and John A., and a brother, John, were with him when the end came. Two other sons, Kenneth and Dan, were unable to be present, as were his daughters, Mrs. McFadden, of Sydney and Mrs. Ferguson of Moncton, and a brother, Donald, of Lot 61.

In the absence of the pastor of the Caledonia Presbyterian church, of which the deceased was a life-long member, the funeral was conducted by the Rev. Mr. Sutherland of Murray Harbor North, and was attended by a large number of friends and neighbors.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, who has been a resident of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. The settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. 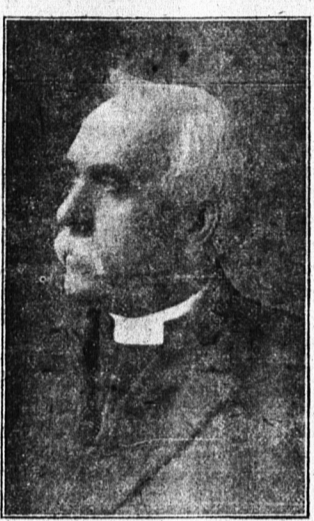

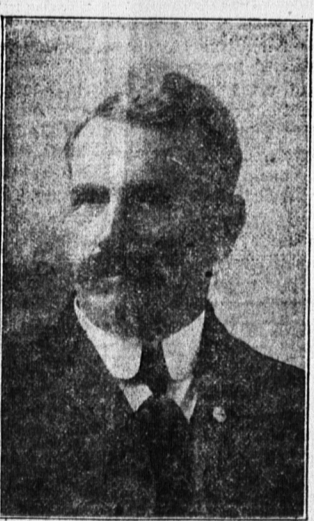
THE LATE GEORGE P. TANTON. The first Grand Master on P. E. Island



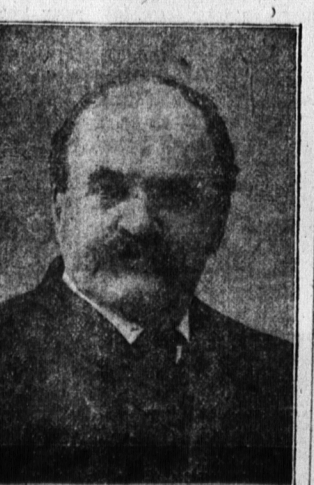

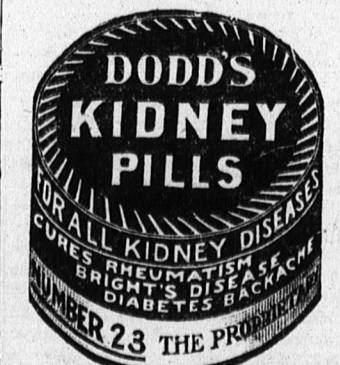
