MAINE BOASTS OF ITS POTATO CROP.

AUGUSTA, Me., March 9—"It need be, the State of Maine could supply the entire nation with potatoes. In 1899 the production was 6,514,235 bushels; in 1909 it reached the stupendous total of 29,500,000 bushels, and no one doubts that the year 1910 will see a further increase, proportionately as large and no less remarkable," is the declaration made in a bulletin issued by the Maine Central Railroad, under the direction of which an investigation of the potato industry of the state has been made.

The average yield an acre in the great potato growing areas of New York, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, Ohio and Minnesota is less than eighty bushels, while in Maine it is quoted at from 200 to 225 bushels an acre. For many years Aroostook county has been the only section of the state in which potatoes could be raised at a profit. It has, however, been discovered that the same crop can be made profitable further to the south and southwest, and in the counties of Piscataquis, Penobscot, Somerset, Lincoln, Waldo, Sagadahoc, Knox and Hancock the conditions for potato growing have been found similar to those in Aroostook.

Experimental work has demonstrated that successful potato raising in Maine depends principally upon the plan of campaign followed in the growing; that is, with the soil and climate as existing, everything rests upon the ideas adopted in planting, developing, harvesting and marketing the crop. It is a peculiar fact that only in a few sections of the country can a reproducing tuber be developed, and Maine is one of the few seed potatoes of the Pine Tree State are not excelled by those of any other region of the United States, and the demand for them is general. The growers of Florida and Texas, particularly, while producing large quantities of potatoes, find the seedlings necessary for continuing their crops for successive years, and they seek the best of the growths.

"The value of the potato lands in Maine within the past few years has been largely enhanced. The report just made by the Maine Commissioner of Agriculture is authority for the statement that a Presque Isle farm of 120 acres was sold last fall for \$10,000; another farm bought twelve years ago for \$3,500 was sold for \$10,000; and another farm of 320 acres bought five years ago for \$12,500, was this season sold for \$30,000. A farm of 120 acres bought for \$1,800 has been sold for \$10,000. Frequent sales of farms of about this acreage are made for from \$10,000 to \$15,000.

MANY MASSACHUSETTS TOWNS CHANGE.

BOSTON, March 9—Some surprising somersaults on the license question were made today by towns in the central and western parts of Massachusetts. Elections were held in nearly two-thirds of the 321 towns in Massachusetts. The aggregate vote on the license issue fell off. A considerable gain was made by the license forces.

The "flops" on the liquor question were the most interesting feature of the elections. Middlefield for the first time in its history went "wet" by a vote of 23 to 20. Amherst by a vote of 367 to 317 entered the yes column for the first time since 1884. The town of Florida went "wet" by a single vote. Greenfield, Athol, Belchertown, Montague, Orange, Williamsburg, Whately, Barre and Grafton

SECRETARY OF STATE

KNOX'S SON MARRIED

PROVIDENCE, R. I., March 8—Wearing a broad wedding band of gold and with a large diamond engagement ring sparkling upon her hand, Miss May Boler, twenty-one years old—a former shop girl, of this city, tonight coyly claimed Philander C. Knox, jr., the twenty-year-old son of the secretary of state, as her husband.

"We were married in Burlington (Vt.), Sunday evening at 7 o'clock, by a minister," she confessed to a reporter after having maintained silence for four hours under a volley of inquiries.

The first revelation today of the romance proved rather disconcerting to young Knox. News of his efforts to obtain a marriage license on Saturday and Sunday in several places on the Canadian border, preceded him. Upon his return, early today, he refused to tell Principal French of the Morris Heights school, where he is a pupil, whether he had been married. Thereupon he was sentenced to imprisonment in his room at the school. Persisting in his refusal, several hours later, he was dismissed from the institution, and left without taking any of his belongings. He left for Washington this evening.

After talking with Secretary of State Knox over the telephone, Principal French left tonight for Washington, there to confer with Mr. Knox. Just before the train started the former Miss Boler, accompanied by a girl companion, also boarded it. Principal French said that he would order the police to put the young woman off at Westerly.

At Westerly, Chief of Police Cornelius Bransfield was assured by young Knox, who also was on the train, having boarded it at Boston, that the elder Knox had expressed approval of his marriage and that he and his bride were speeding to receive the parental blessing. 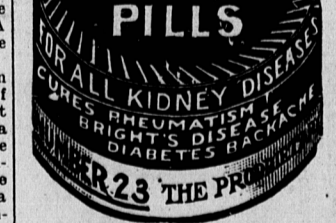

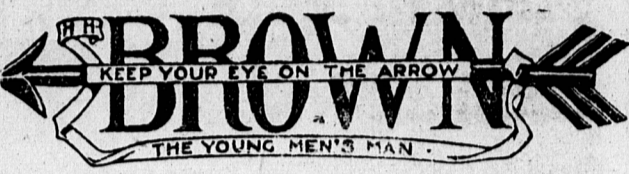
