FEVER IN OTTAWA.

OTTAWA, Jan. 19—A serious epidemic of typhoid fever threatens Ottawa. Within the last forty hours over 50 cases of fever have been reported to the medical health officers. The lowness of the water in the Ottawa river, the source of supply, is the cause attributed, and the treatment of the water with hypo-chloride will be immediately inaugurated.

HORSE RACE ON WEST RIVER ICE

What was in all probability the first ice race of the season was held on the West River ice Wednesday afternoon.

The ice was in splendid condition for good going and quite a large crowd assembled to witness the sport which was to say the least of an exciting order.

The race was over a three quarter mile course and was the best out of five heats.

Neil McEachern, Allan McDougall and Mac McNeill were the owners of the horses entered.

The first heat went to McEachern's Lou Oakley, who was one hundred yards ahead at the finish. McNeill's Nancy Mac came in second and McDougall's Minnie E. was third.

The second heat was captured by Minnie E., Lou Oakley breaking when 100 yards from the finish. Nancy Mac was third.

In the third heat Lou Oakley acted badly and was awarded second position, Minnie E., getting first, and Nancy Mac third.

Minnie E., got first place, Lou Oakley second and Nancy Mac third. Minnie E. a Parkside, is one year older than her other two competitors which are both Oakley Barons, and are racing for the first time. Lou Oakley was greatly admired by all present.

The following is the scoring: Minnie E., owned and driven by Allan McDougall, Long Creek, 3 1 1; Lou Oakley, owned and driven by Neil McEachern, Nine Mile Creek, 1 2 2; Nancy Mac, owned and driven by Mac McNeill, Long Creek, 2 3 3.

The officials were: Starters—Silas McNeill and Augustus Down, Long Creek. Judges—Hector McLean and Nelson Currie, Long Creek.

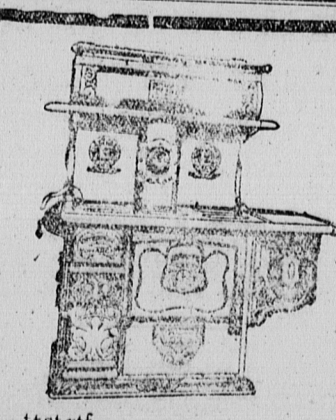
