The driver, Maurice Bosse, of St. Joseph, Madawaska county, thought all of the train had passed. Its rear cars were still rushing by in the darkness, however, and Bosse was unable to avoid a collision. The motor car was totally wrecked.

### Police Renew Search For Jilted Suitor In Slaying

### Cyclone Sweeps Path Through Ontario County

"Twister" Claims One Life And Property Damage Estimated At Over \$60,000.

By Guardian's Special Wire) CORNWALL, Ont., Aug. 1.—Completely demolishing dwelling houses and barns, a cyclone swept a narrow path across a section of Stormont County this afternoon, took one life and left in its wake damage which has been estimated at more than \$60,000. The twister was seen approaching Newington village, which is about 18 miles northwest of Cornwall, about two o'clock this afternoon and it was in that village and immediate districts where the greater part of the damage was done.

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### Tentative Program To Be Submitted To Ethiopia Today

Italian Press Clamors For Complete Submission Of African Nation As Additional Troops Are Dispatched.
