WHAT WOMEN CAN DO.

Some years ago a few ladies got together and resolved to do what they could to lessen the pain and sorrow of the City of London. They had some money of their own. They made no public appeal for funds, and made no announcement of their purpose. They banded themselves together as a community and bought an old house in West London with extensive grounds. Then they went out to seek the most helpless and repulsive objects of pity they could find. They gathered in hunchbacks, women stricken with malignant diseases—victims of lupus whose faces were being slowly eaten away by the wolf-like tuberculosis, the incurable, and the dying. They took them to

their home, they gave them love and kindness, they kept them not for a day, not for a week, but year after year—ten, twelve, twenty years, until death came. And when one died others were found. They built themselves a chapel, for they are Churchwomen working under their Bishop, and here in this chapel each Sunday evening the patients are brought in, many of them on stretchers, unable to move, some supported by the arm, some led in—the blind, the maimed, the halt, brought together by all-embracing love. The scene is enough to make one weep. In fact it does make some of those weep who see it for the first time. To give our money to the sick is not so much. Most of us can find a fugitive dollar for something that appeals to our sense of compassion. But to give oneself, not for a day but for a whole lifetime to the most miserable and pitiful of humanity, there lay surely the supreme realization of self-sacrifice.

CHARGED WITH TAKING GOODS FALSELY.

BOSTON, Srpt. 17.—William V. Collier, formerly managing director of Rudd and Collier, Limited, of Bristol, England, was arrested in Stoneham to-day on a charge of obtaining under false pretences, leather valued at \$2,000. The concerns from which Collier is alleged to have secured the leather are Samuel Barrow and Brother, Limited, and George Angus and Company, Limited, Bristol. Collier pleaded not guilty before United States Commissioner Hayes, and was held for a hearing on Friday.

UNIONIST TALK, A BLUFF.

WINNIPEG, Sept. 17.—"Unionist talk in Ulester is all a bluff," said Right Hon. Sir Thomas Whittaker, M. P., the well known publicist and financier of London here today. "They said the same thing forty-four years ago, when we disestablished the Irish church. They were going to lay down their lives and they went to bed instead. Home rule for Ireland will be a law inside of three years, if we can carry the bill through the house three times, and I feel that will be easily accomplished." Sir Thomas, who will make investments in western Canada on behalf of the great assurance companies with which he is connected, said they were all agreed on the need for an all-powerful navy and would welcome the free co-operation of Canada.

SPEAKS BEFORE CANADIAN CLUB.

VICTORIA, B. C., Sept. 16.—Hon. Walter Long, M. P., speaking before the Canadian Club here today, said the time had come for reciprocal action in imperial defence. With this accomplishment and the provision of trade arrangements the empire would become self-supporting and could dispense with outside allowance.

In pleading for imperial co-operation he said that the mother country the Canadian Club here today said but altered circumstances made closer co-operation necessary to maintain imperial unity. His sentiments were endorsed by Sir Richard McBride.

CROSSING GATES OF LITTLE USE.

MONCTON, N. B., Sep. 16.—Coroner Purdy tonight began an inquest into the death of Mrs. John O'Rourke, who met such a shocking death at the Main street railway crossing Saturday afternoon by being run over by a shunter.

F. P. Brady, J. B. T. Caron of the I. C. R. board of management, R. Colclough, assistant district superintendent, and Chief Train Dispatcher Fleming were present on behalf of the railway. Dr. O. B. Price is foreman of the jury and the jurors subjected the witnesses of a rigid examination as to shunting over Main street crossing.

RECORD BREAKING SALE OF SHEEP.

WEISER, Idaho, Sept. 16.—Sheep breeders and dealers from many sections of the country gathered here today for the opening of the largest auction sale of sheep ever conducted in the United States. The sale will last two days and will comprise 12,500 thoroughly bred and registered sheep, the property of the insolvent Butterfield Livestock Company. The list of animals to go under the auctioneer's hammer includes 500 Rambouillet rams, 900 Delaine-Merino rams, 800 Hampshire ram lambs, and several thousand mixed Rambouillet, Delaine and Hampshire ewes.

FORTY INDICTED FOR MURDER

DETROIT, Mich., Sept. 16.—Indictments against 32 persons were returned today by a jury in the federal courts here. Twenty people are charged with white slavery. Among the other cases is an indictment charging William Ferguson, a cripple, with murder on the high seas. Ferguson must stand trial for the shooting of Canadian Immigration Inspector Herbert, which occurred several weeks ago on a ferry between Detroit and Windsor. The punishment under the U. S. laws is death. Capital punishment has not been inflicted in Michigan in years.

FEDERALS DEFEAT REBELS.

EL PASO, Sept. 16.—Ojibwa, the

Mexican border town, opposite Presidio, Texas, was taken by federal troops after brisk fighting yesterday.

General Steever also received a report from army officers from Presidio, Texas, that Col. Pascual Orozco, father of the leader of the rebels, was captured yesterday and is held by United States troops at Presidio together with Col. P. G. Orozco. Whether General Pascual Orozco, Jr., the rebel commander-in-chief, was fighting at Ojibwa or escaped over the international line into the United States, is not known. Federal forces, numbering 350, under command of Col. Manuel Landu entered Ojibwa proper, driving the rebels before them.

FORBID FLYING AT TWILIGHT.

CHICAGO, Sept. 16.—Twilight flying was forbidden to-day by officials of the Illinois Aero Club, as a result of the death of Howard Gill, who was killed in a mid-air collision Saturday. One reason for Gill's death was that the race was started after twilight had set in. It was announced that flying will begin half an hour earlier each day.
