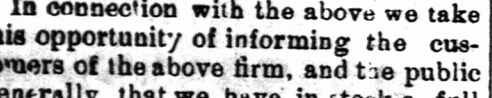

PROSPEROUS NOVA SCOTIA.

Premier Murray in making his budget speech in the Nova Scotia Legislature on Tuesday last was able to make a most favorable financial showing for his province. The revenue for the year was \$76,829 dollars. The large sum is mainly made up of two items, the subsidies and interest received from Ottawa and the royalties from the coal and gold mines. The province has over a million dollars standing to its credit at Ottawa which yields 5 per cent interest. This and the regular subsidy make \$32,837 dollars. The mining royalties of the year yielded the large sum of 319,150 dollars.

Quite contrary to the experiences of some other provinces, Nova Scotia has found her revenue increasing from year to year. In 1882 the entire receipts of the province from all sources were 541,730 dollars. In 1890 they had increased to 664,938 dollars—and last year, as above stated the total was \$76,823 dollars. This great gain has been almost wholly due to the mineral resources of the province being turned to account as a source of revenue. A great impetus to the coal production was given by the sale of the coal mines to the Whitney syndicate a few years ago.

The outlook for increased revenue from the royalty on coal in the years immediately to come is bright, owing to new demands arising in two quarters. One of these is a great coke industry now being established near Boston which will depend wholly upon Nova Scotia as its source of supply. Mr. Murray intimates that this one concern will probably require yearly as much coal as is now shipped from Nova Scotia to the Upper Provinces. There is also in near prospect the vast demand for coal by the new iron and steel works at Sydney, which will be much the largest industrial concern in Canada. Such are some of the bright prospects of the near future, which seem to justify the prediction of Premier Murray that the mineral revenues of the province may presently exceed in amount the annual subsidy which the province receives from Ottawa.

The steamer Milwaukee whose sailing from Halifax was noted in our despatches of yesterday, is taking to South Africa 638 officers and men and 650 horses. The force includes 408 officers and men of the Canadian Mounted Rifles, 198 officers and men of the Royal Canadian Artillery and 30 officers and men attached, of whom eight are officers and 22 artificers.

The Grand Trunk Railway Company has declared a dividend of 3 1/2 per cent on its second preference stock, which stock had yielded no returns during twelve years past. This may be hoped to mark a turn in the tide so far as this great railway system is concerned. The fact is that nothing has done more in the past to discourage the investment of British capital in Canada than this same Grand Trunk. The original investors in it practically lost their entire investment. Why it was that a railway system connecting all the principal cities of Canada, and for a long time affording the only railway outlet from the Upper Provinces to the sea, could not be made to pay, was one of the things that was never satisfactorily explained. Why it should pay better now with the I. C. R. and C. P. R. as competing lines, can be explained on the ground of improved financial management.

Yesterday was the anniversary of the birthday of Washington, and a great day among our United States cousins. He was born in Westmorland County, Virginia on February 11, 1732 (old style). By the new style of reckoning the anniversary falls on February 22. His death occurred on 14th December 1799. No name in the entire history of the Republic is so much revered as that of Washington. In civic as in military life he was distinguished among his contemporaries for the clearness and soundness of his judgment, for his moderation and self-control, for the quiet dignity and the indomitable firmness with which he pursued every path which he had deliberately chosen. "The Father of his Country" as he is affectionately styled by United States citizens, has long been held in high estimation throughout the civilized world and especially in England. Lord Brougham pronounced Washington "the greatest man of modern times, if not the greatest of any age."
