THANKS CANADA ASKS TO MUCH
London, Aug. 1.—The Morning Post points out that Canada has raised £20,000,000 in London recently, and depreciates the too rapid borrowing.
It remarks that the excess of imports, the past quinquennial over exports of £35,000,000 is unhealthy in the case of a country paying a large interest abroad.

A NEW LINE OF RAILWAY
MONTREAL Aug 1.—The contract for the construction of the Cental Railway has been signed by the Dominion Engineering Co., of Toronto, of which Mr. Randolph Macdonald is president.
The Central Railway Company's line is to be 345 miles long, with 37 miles in branches. It is to be extended from Montreal to Midland on the Georgian Bay. The bond issue of £2,350,000 has been underwritten in England. They are five per cent. first mortgage bonds and will be offered to the public at 70.
