LONDON, Jan. 17.—(CP Cable)—

Prime Minister Churchill has received from Premier Wladislaw Sikorski, head of the Polish government, a cheque for 450 (about \$1,000) for the relief of the Guildhall, destroyed by Nazi incendiary bombs during the great fire-raid on London a month ago. The gift was made, although no plans have been formulated for reconstruction, and Mr. Churchill wrote in reply that "this is a moving token which will stir the hearts of everyone in this city and in the Empire."

MONCTON, N.B., Jan. 17.—(CP)—

The Canadian National Railways freight shed at New Mills, about midway between Bathurst and Campbellton, was demolished this morning about 2:30 o'clock when 15 cars of pulp and paper were derailed and piled into it. Other damage was considerable but none of the train crew was injured. Cause of the accident has been laid to a broken wheel, probably the result of the extreme temperatures experienced in the district last week.

Serious teacher shortage may develop in Alberta if the war continues, and male teachers continue to enlist in the armed forces or undertake war work. Dr. G. S. Lord, senior principal of Provincial Normal schools and principal of the Edmonton Normal, said yesterday.

CALGARY, Jan. 17.—(CP)—

Oil production in Turney Valley will be raised from 22,000 barrels to 25,000 barrels per day as war measure, by orders of the Dominion Oil Controller, G. R. Cottrell, of Toronto, according to word received by R. E. Allen, chairman of the Alberta Petroleum and Natural Gas Conservation Board, today.

LONDON, Jan. 17.—(CP Cable)—

Safe arrival at a northwest port of a new detachment of young men trained in Canada under the Empire Air Scheme for the Royal Canadian Air Force, was announced today. Recruited from all parts of Canada, most of them are wireless operators. The group included also an Australian flying officer and a number of sergeants from New Zealand.

Robert M. Fowler, a former secretary of the Sirois Commission, told a meeting of the young men's section of the Board of Trade here last night, that the Sirois report is now dead, but may prove to be a "very troublesome corpse."

War - 25 Years Ago Today

(By The Canadian Press) JAN. 18, 1916—Turkish forces in Armenia routed by Russians who captured Koprucki. French barbed wire shattered German trenches between Oise and the Aisne on the Western Front. French armoured tanks attacked stations at Metz and Arras.

Since the union of the two countries no Scottish peers have been created. Scots raised to the peerage are now included in the peerage of the United Kingdom.

In 1801, at the time of the union of Great Britain and Ireland, the Irish peerage was allotted 28 representative peers elected for life. This representation still continues despite the creation in 1922 of the Irish Free State and the introduction in recent years of the new constitution of Eire.
