

WILL KISSING BE PROHIBITED

The Osculatory Process Denounced by Scientists as Extremely Dangerous—How the Danger Can be Removed.

How Longboat Became a Runner

How the Indian Runner Who Won the Boston Marathon Found Out That He Was Able to Jog Along As Fast as a Horse.

Toronto, May 1.—The story of Longboat's discovery of his ability as a long distance runner is interesting and has the indorsement of the now famous Indian himself.
Longboat had been known as a good runner on the Indian reservation at Caledonia, which is about fifteen miles from Hamilton, but while he could beat any of the Indians at distances from a mile up to five, there was no idea that he had it in him to break world's records from ten miles up to twenty-five, which is what he has done since last fall.

One day last September, Longboat drove with his father and mother from the reservation into Hamilton. Arriving in the city Longboat was left to his own devices, but warned to turn up at the stable where the horse had been left in time to start for home by five o'clock.
Visits to Hamilton were few and far between for Longboat, and the young Indian put in his time seeing the sights, admiring the store window displays, and having as good a time as he could without any money in his pocket. In spite of that handicap he had so good a time that it was after five o'clock before he remembered that he had to go back to Caledonia.
He hurried to the stable and found that his father, with the stoic sternness of the Indian, had started for home, leaving Tom to get there the best way he could.

There was nothing left but to hoof it the fifteen miles. Tom when he got outside the city limits, started with a swinging lunge, hoping to catch up with the old horse. Mile after mile he jogged along, and no sign of the people appeared in the dusty road ahead. He increased the pace, and still no sign. When he had covered half the distance, he was surprised to find that he was not in the least winded or fatigued.

About three miles from the reservation, he came to a fork in the roads, either of which would take him home, with little choice in the distance. It so happened that Longboat chose one road, while his father had driven over the other and Longboat arrived at the reservation ahead of the old horse. His father was actually surprised when he arrived and found Tom home ahead of him.

The news of Longboat's run was soon the talk of the reservation, and it was decided that he should enter the Hamilton road race in October.
Longboat appeared at the starting point in an extraordinary rig-out made up of an old bathing suit and a pair of old bicycle shoes. He had instructed one of the women of experience, a former winner of the race, to try to keep up with the leader and not to pass him until near the end of the race.
Longboat followed his instructions and so worried the leader who worked into the position after the first few miles that he practically ran him off his feet. Longboat forged ahead and finished nearly two miles ahead of the second man.

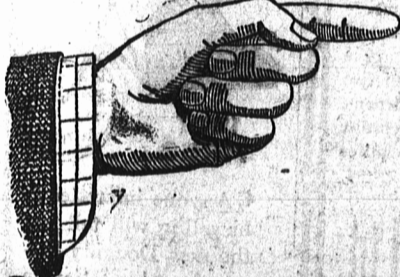

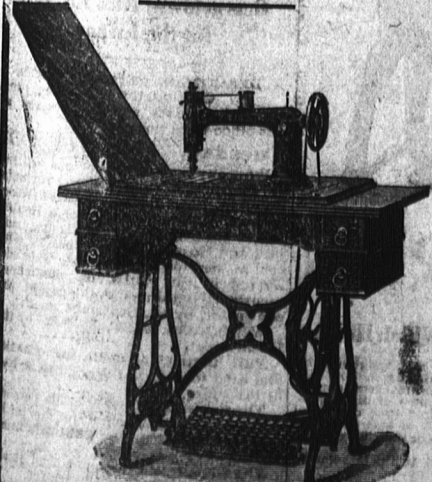

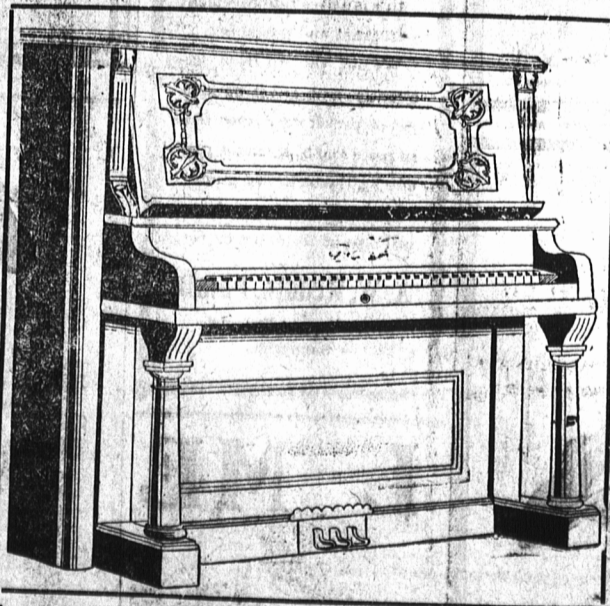
